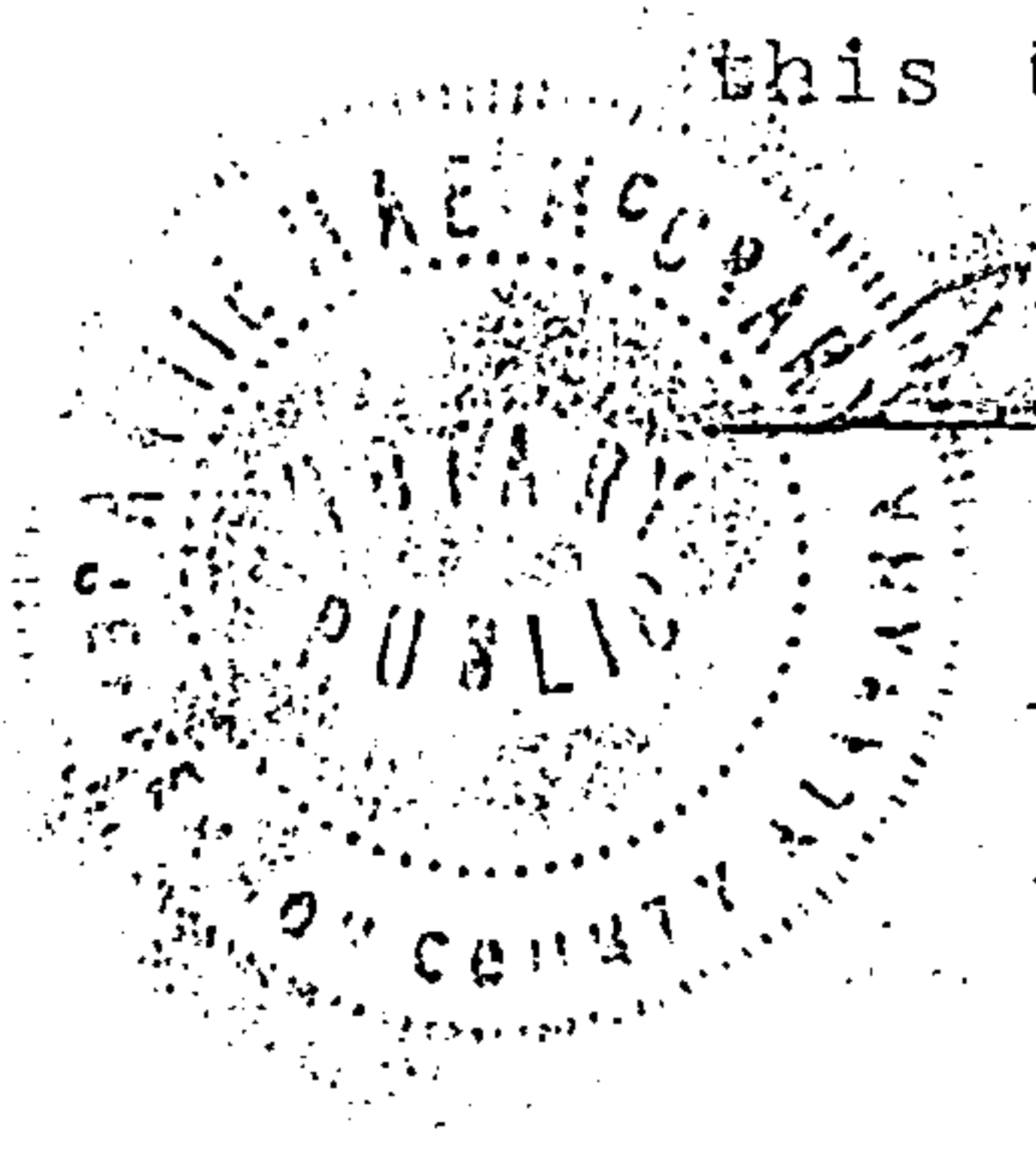

I am the grantor, Needham A. Graham, Jr., in that certain warranty deed dated July 29, 1908, and recorded in Deed Book 41 page 271 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, which said deed conveyed to Annie Lee O'Neal all of the southeast quarter of Section 32 and that part of the west half of the southwest quarter of Section 33 lying west of and adjacent to the L. & N. R. R. in Township 21 South Range 2 West. I hereby certify that I was an unmarried man on the date of the execution of said deed. *I signed said deed "N. A. Graham, Jr." using my initials only and did not write out my first name in full.*

I knew, during his life time, S. J. Large, the grantor in that certain quit claim deed dated January 4, 1900, and recorded in said Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 25 page 25, which said deed conveyed to Annie Lee O'Neal the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 32 Township 21 Range 2 West. S. J. Large was a merchant who lived at Calera, Alabama, and he is now dead. I know that he never married and consequently was an unmarried man on the date of the execution of said deed to Annie Lee. O'Neal.
