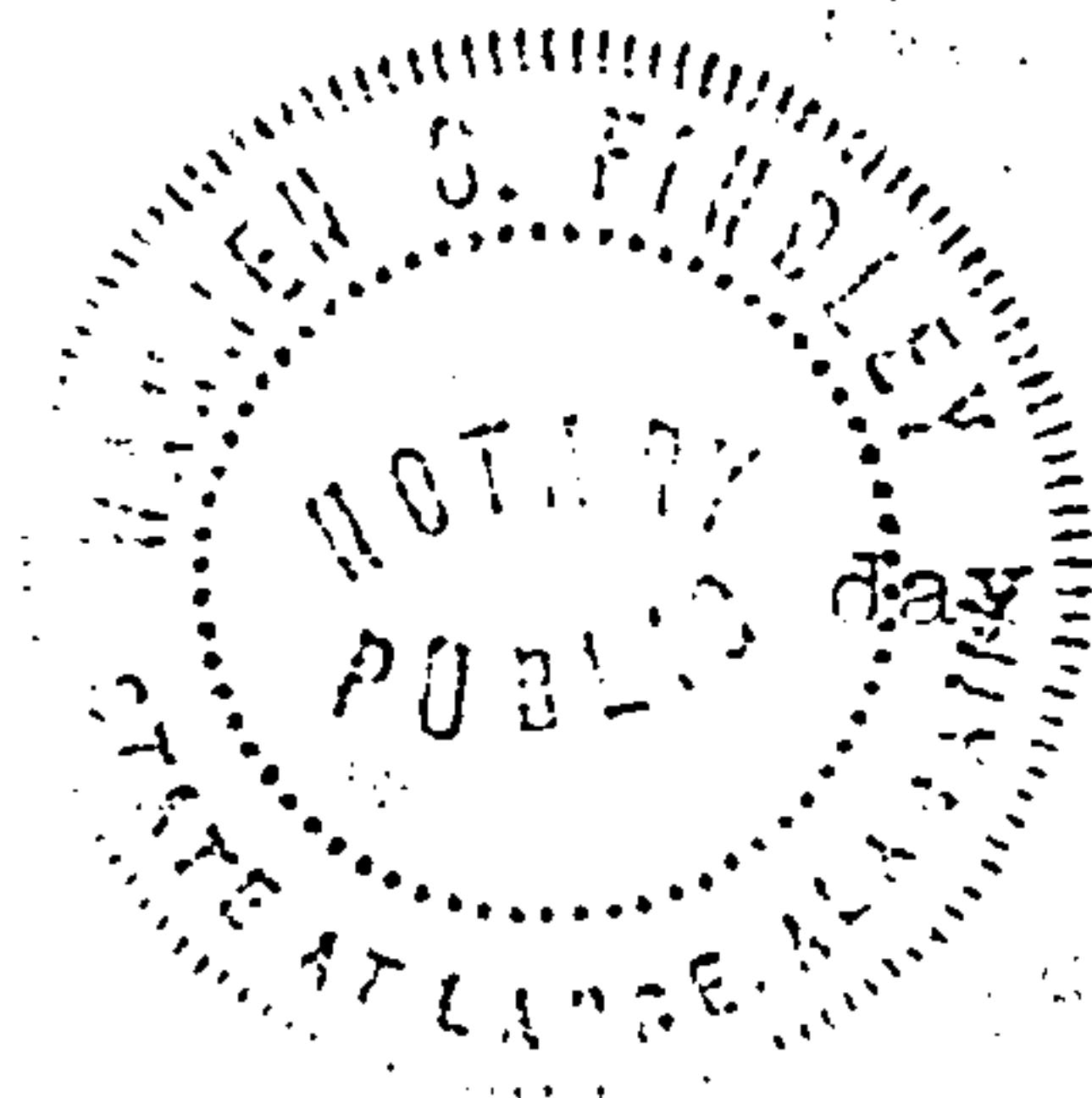

Affiant further says that said lots have been used as residential lots for more than fifty years; that this property was formerly known as W.M. Aldridge lots, later known as E.A. Aldridge lots and as Jesse A. Aldridge lots; since 1926 said lots have been known as the H.C. Baker lots, and have been used as residential sites to this present time; said lots now have one residence situated thereon, extending back across both lots, and formerly had two residences situated thereon.

Affiant further says that he knows of his own personal knowledge that for the past thirty-five neither John S. Storrs, or his heirs, or his executor, or W.P. Brown & Sons Lumber Company, or the Calera Lime Corporation, or the heirs of Joseph W. Dimmick, or W.C. Gewin, or Calera Development Company, or O'Neal Lime Works, or the Alabama Lime and Stone Corporation, or the First National Bank of Birmingham have ever been in the possession of the said lots.

Affiant further says that of his own personal knowledge he knows that for more than thirty-five years, last past, that H.C.Baker, and those through whom the said H.C.Baker holds title, namely, Jesse A.Aldridge, and E.A. Aldridge, to the above described lots, has been, respectively, in the open, notorious, continuous, peaceable, and adverse possession of the said lots, claiming said lots as his/ own, respectively, against all the world, and regularly and continuously using and occupying the same as residential property, and that affiant has never heard the title of the said H.C.Baker, or those through whom he holds title to said lots to be questioned in any way by any one.
