KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Joseph P. Dimmick of said State and County, being of sound mind and desiring to make suitable disposition of my property in the event of my death to make, publish, and declare the following as and for my last Will and testament: .

Item 1. I desire all of my just debts to be paid as soon as practicable after my death.

Item 2. Subject to the payment of my debts, I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Nora Spann Dimmick all of my property of every character and description, both real estate and personal property and wherever situated, the same to belong to her absolutely in fee simple.

Item 3. I hereby nominate and appoint my said wife as the Executrix of this Will and hereby expressly exempt her from giving any bond or security as such Executrix. I further direct that after the Probate of this Will that my wife shall not be required to file any inventory of my estate in the Probate Court, and I further direct that there shall be no further proceedings in regard to my estate in any Court and that my wife as Executrix shall not be required to make any report to or settlement with any Court of my estate, but that she shall be absolutely free to handle the property of my estate in such manner as she may see fit and shall have full power and authority to sell or dispose of any of said property at any time she may see fit and for any purpose which she may desire.

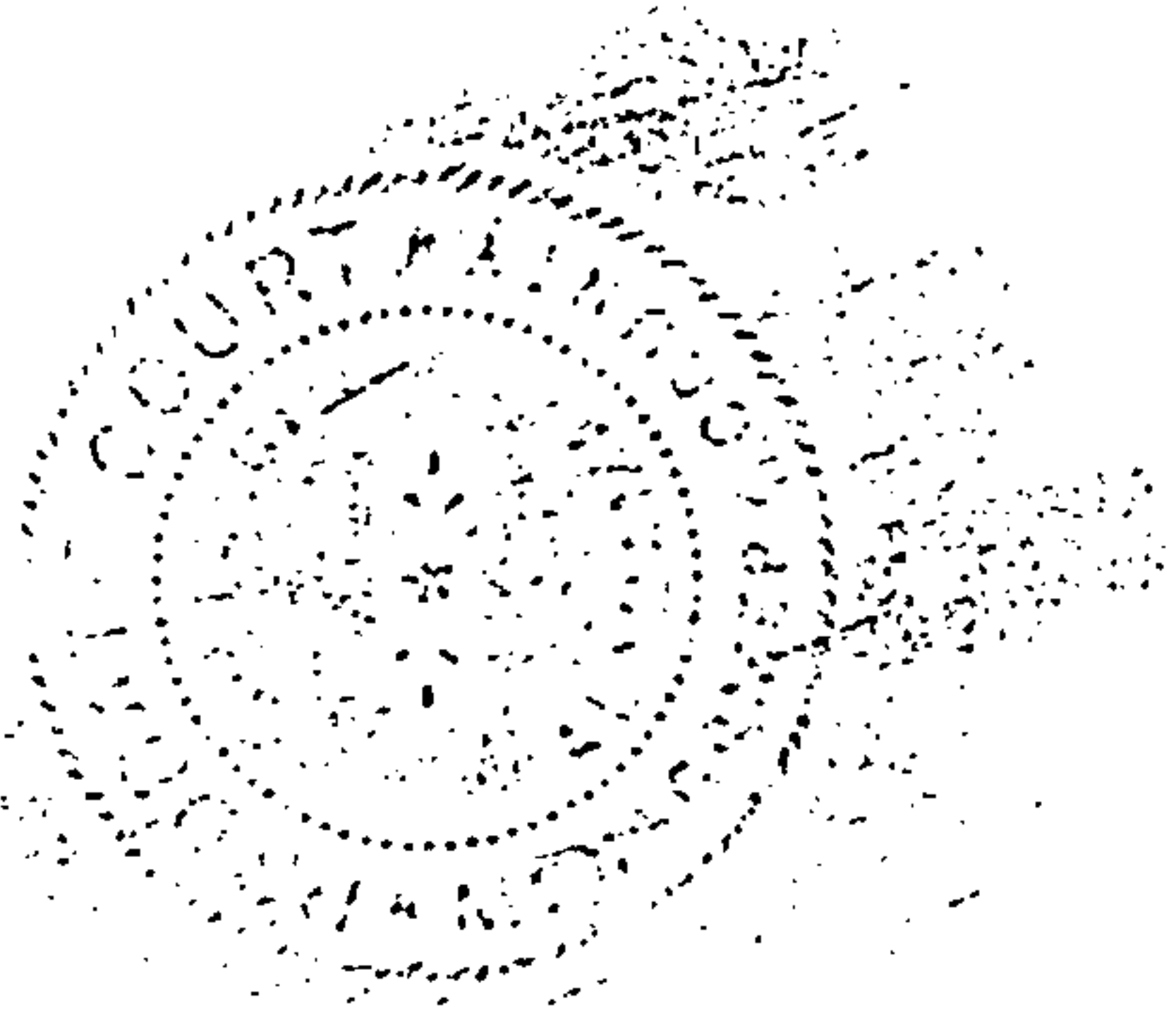
