Before the undersigned authority, personally appeared Fannie T. Hinds who is known to me and who being by me first duly sworn deposes and says:

I live at Arkwright, Alabama and have been living there more than thirty years. I am acquainted with Lots 6 and 7, Block 19 according to the map of Arkwright, Alabama.

In 1936 L. L. Harris had these lots fenced up and was using them as a garden. His wife was Julia Harris and after his death, Julia Harris remained in possession of them until she deeded them to Reese Howell Harris. I have gathered vegetables out of that garden many times. When Mr. Reese Howell Harris obtained title to the property he tore the fence down, but continued to have it cultivated and these lots have been in actual cultivation in the manner aforementioned since 1936. Mr. L. L. Harris and Julia Harris were claiming to own the lots when they were cultivating them and were in actual, open, notorious, exclusive, hostile and adverse possession down to the time L. L. Harris died, and Julia Harris deeded the lots to Reese Howell Harris & in 1950.
