I bought these lands about the year/from Mrs. F. P. Shealy, who was the surviving widow of F. P. Shealy. I bought the lands for the purposes of getting the timber on said lands, therefore, shortly after I purchased the lands I went onto thelands and cut the timber, built roads on it and hauled the timber out. I exercised full control of the lands during the time I owned them. I am 59 years of are and have lived at Sterrett, Shelby County, Alabama, all my lifetime and have been a sawmiller for about 35 years. I remeber the time that: Mr. Arlin Watson cut the timber on these lands for Fr. J.H. Wilder: . To the best of my recollection it was about the year1929 or 1929. that Mr. Watson cut the timber. I know that Mr. J. H. Wilder claimed the lands as his own and exercised full control over said lands except that he did not go into possession as the lands are not fit for homesteading, just fit for growing timber. I remember that Er. Arlin Watson went onto the lands as arent for Fr. J. H. Wilder and cut the timber and built roads on the lands with which to haul the timber out. This land is located in very rough country; there is a big hill down the middle of the SE4 of Section 16, Township 18, Range 2, East.
