receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, sold and by these presents hereby remises, releases and forever quitclaims unto the said Mrs. Sadie Pate Benson, her heirs and assigns, all the right, title and interest of the said United States of America at the time of the last named sale in the real estate located in the Internal Revenue District of Alabama, which real estate is bounded and described as follows in the deed executed to the United States of America on February 15, 1937, by the said Harwell G. Davis, then Collector of Internal Revenue in and for the Collection District of Alabama, to-wit:

> "Lots 30, 31 and 32 in Block 90 as shown by Safford's Map of Shelby, Shelby County, Alabama."

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME, and all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the grantee, her heirs and assigns, forever, free from any claim on the part of the United States of America.
