In the name of God, Amen:

I, Joseph W. Dimmick, a reident of the City of Montgomery and County of Montgomery and State of Alabama, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make and ordain this, my last will and testament, as follows:

Item First: I hereby direct that out of the assets of my estate my Executor hereinafter named pay all my just debts and liabilities, and that such payment be made as soon as the same can be made, without sacrifice to the value of my estate.

Item Second. I hereby give and bequeath to my wife, the dwelling house in the said City of Hontgomery in which we now reside, and the lot upon which it is situated, including the stable erected thereon; also the furniture, pictures, plate, and all other articles of personal property of every kind and description in said dwelling house at the time of my death; also the horses, carriage and harness.

To Have and To Hold all of the same to her own use, forever.

Item Three. I hereby give and bequeath to the Church of the Holy Comfortor the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.00) for the benefit of the poor of said Church, and request the officers of the Church to cause the said sum of money to be loaned out on good security and to use the income derived therefrom to relieve the poor and needy, as may appear to the best interests of the Church and to the promotion and advancement of Christ's Kingdom on earth.

Item Four. I hereby direct my Executor, hereinafter named, to deliver to my daughter, Mrs. Winona Dimmick Wilson, Two (2) bonds of the Montgomery Street Railway, of One Thousand (\$1,600.00) Dollars each, and direct that the income that may be derived therefrom be used by my said daughter in aid of the education of my two grand-sons, her children, Joseph Dimmick Wilson and John Roper Wilson; the bonds to be by her turned over to my said grand-sons as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty-one years.

Item Five. The residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal, mixed and choses in actions, of every kind and description,

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I horeby dovise and bequeath to my wife and out four children, namely: Winona, Joseph P., Margaret and Annie May, share and share alike. It is my wish and I hereby request that the money which may be derived from the policies of insurance on my life, shall form a part of my estate, and be distributed according to the provisions of this, Item Five, of this will.

I hereby appoint my son, Joseph Phillips Dimmick, Executor of this, my last will and tostament, without bond, and hereby give, and grant unto my said Executor, full power and authority to manage the affairs of my estate as he may doom to the best interests thereof in carrying into effect the provisions of this will.

I further direct that he shall not be required to render to any Court of the State of Alabama, any appraisement of my estate or to account to any such Court for his administration of the affairs of my estate. As soon after he takes charge of the affairs of my estate as he deems practicable, I direct that after the payment of my just debts and the legacies mentioned in Item Three and in Item Four of this will, he shall make a partial distribution, as required in Item Five, and that final distribution shall be made within Eighteen (18) months after the time when he assumes the duties of administering the affairs of my estate, if it can be done without sacrifice, and sooner, if practicable.

For his services in performing the duties of Executor, I direct that he be paid One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars.

In Testimony Whereof, I, the said Joseph W. Dimmick, have, to this, my last will and testament, subscribed my name and affixed my seal, this the 20th day of April, 1906.
