

Personally appeared before me, B. J. Dryer, a notary public for the State of Alabama, at large, Mary Johnson, who being by me first duly sworn, on oath, deposes and says as follows:

I am the Mother of Nancy Wright, who was the wife of George L. Wright, deceased, and am familiar with the ownership and possession of the following property since it was bought by George L. Wright in 1904.

Beginning at the Northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 11, Township 19, Range 2 West and run thence South along the East line of said forty acres, a distance of 237 feet to the Helena Road; run thence in a South-westerly direction, along said road, a distance of 189 feet; run thence in a Northwesterly direction 613 feet, more or less, to a point on the North boundary line of said forty acres, which is 496 feet West from the starting point; run thence in an Easterly direction along the North line of said forty acres, a distance of 496 feet to the point of beginning and being located in the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 11, Township 19, Range 2 West, Mineral and Mining rights excepted, and situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

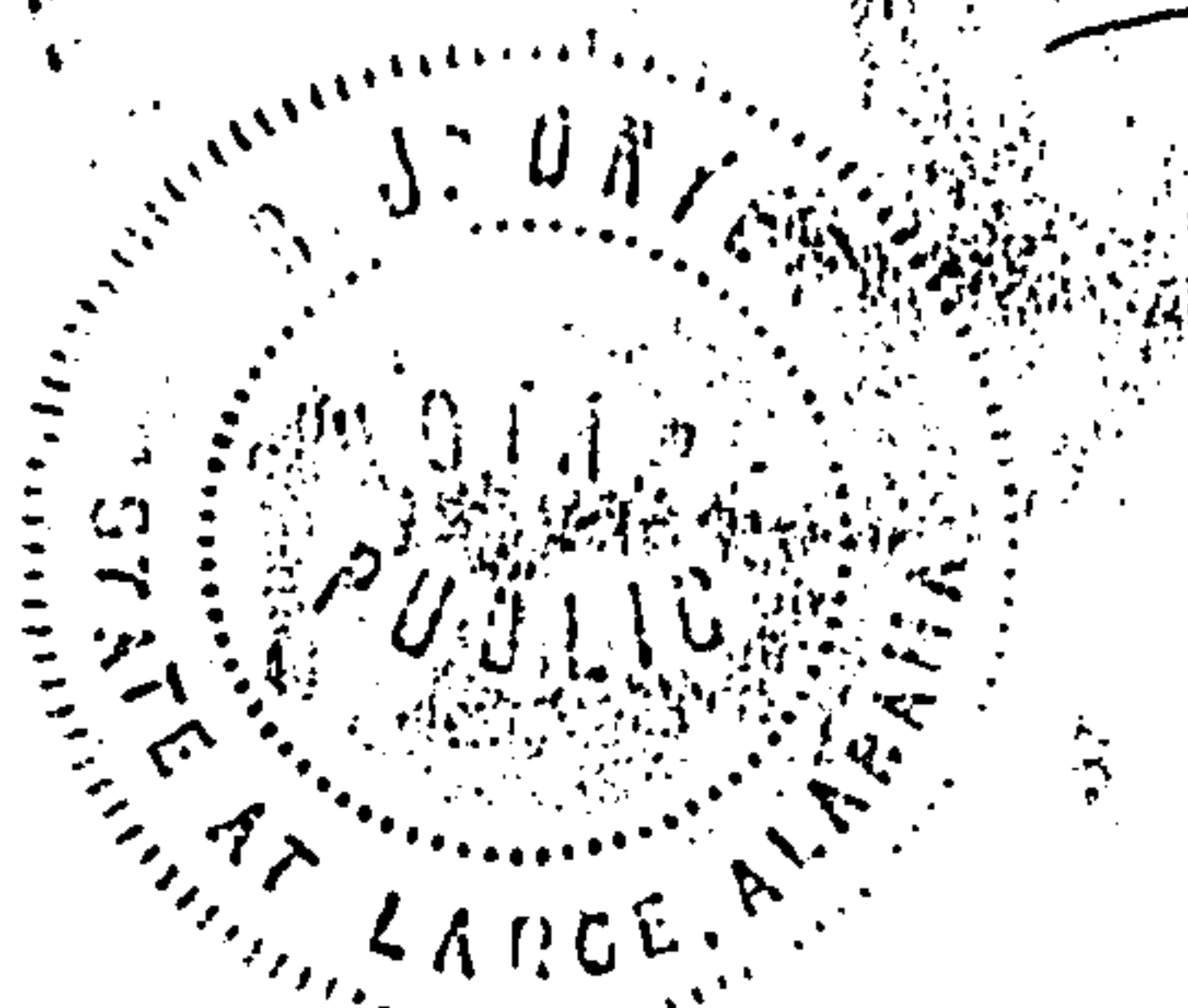
George L. Wright was married to Paralee Wright, prior to his marriage to Nancy, but secured a divorce from Paralee before the purchase of the above land. In 1904, George L. Wright took possession of said property and lived on it and cultivated and otherwise used it until his death in 1941. Nancy Wright, the widow of George Wright, sold the property in the same year to Kenneth P. Fulmer and his wife, and they sold said land to G. W. Fulmer, who in turn sold said land to Frances E. Howard.

Each of the above persons either lived on said land and cultivated and used the same or rented it to tenants who used it in the same manner and the possession of each of them, during the period of their ownership was and has been exclusive, adverse, hostile, undisputed, open, continuous and notorious covering a total period, to my knowledge, of 50 years preceding the date of this affidavit.
