All of the land was Cencel up along the West line of the Railroad on down to the South line of the SUR of the SUR of said Section 1 and the fence was extended West along the South line of said SW# of SW4 and the South line of the SE4 of the SE4 of Section 2 and then extended North for a considerable distance along the West line of the SER of the SER of said Section 2 and the fence then agnled across to the West line of the railroad right of way.
