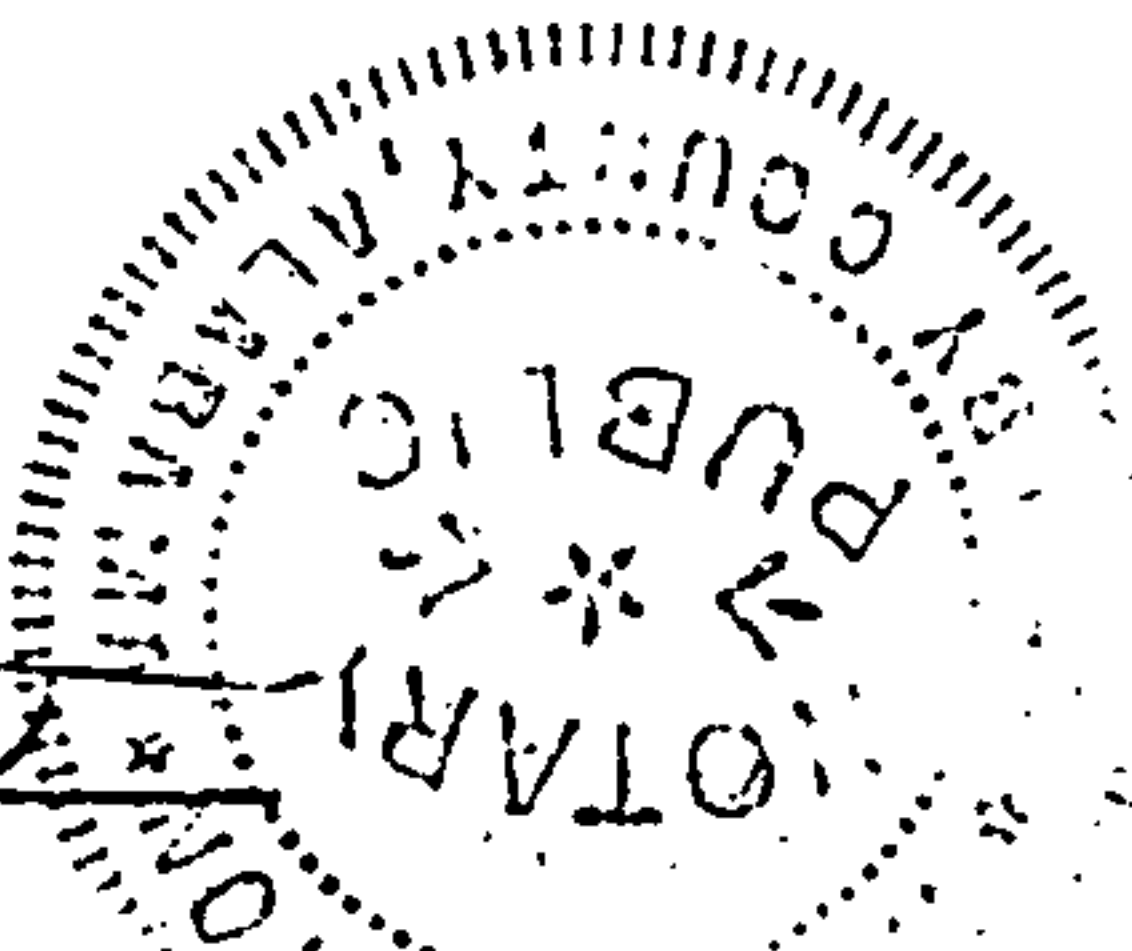
My husband and I lived on the above described property from the date purchased until 1941 and was at all times in peaceful possession. We were not molested by anyone; no other person has asserted in any way ownership or any interest in the property; no one claimed any title to the property other than my husband and I. There was no title adverse to our own; our possession was continuous, peaceful, adverse, open, hostile and notorious to the whole world.

I lived on above property with my husband J. W. Bramblett, who is now deceased. We sold the property to Leo Loper in 1941.
