My grantor, Leo Loper, resided on the property above described, as sole owner, from July 28, 1941 until February 29, 1952. His possession was peaceful, open, and notorious. I know of no claim of title adverse to Leo Loper's during the period of Mr. Loper's ownership, July 28, 1941 to February 29, 1952.
