Thornton and I am 67 years of age and a resident of Jefferson County, Alabama and have been for 49 years. I am the John W. Thornton named as grantor in that certain deed dated November 14, 1917 from the ~~xx~~ heirs at law of James G. Thornton to Rev. S. Smitherman which conveys a tract of land known as the Nancy T. Nichols place, said deed being recorded in deed book 63, page 145 of the Office of Judge of Probate, Shelby County, Alabama. I know from my own personal knowledge that the parties named in said deed were all the heirs at law who were living at the time of the death of James G. Thornton, as I am the son of said James G. Thornton. There was a daughter named Mary Melissa Thornton, but she died before my father did and had not married at the time of her death and left no heirs. My father died on July 28, 1909.
