My name is F. J. Mitchell. I am familiar with the affairs of Alabama Lime and Stone Corporation and know it conveyed all its property to Southern Lime Corporation about the year 1942 and thereafter the Alabama Lime and Stone Corporation ceased to do business and the same is now a defunct corporation. I am also familiar with the affairs of Southern Lime Corporation. I was an officer of that Company, my title being PRESIDENT. Said Company dissolved a few years ago and I have been acting as trustee and agent since that time for the purpose of winding up its business.

I am informed that Alabama Lime and Stone Corporation formerly owned the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 2, Township 24, Range 13 East and that it attempted to convey the same to R. L. Holcombe on July 25, 1929, as shown by deed recorded in Deed Book 90 Page 127. I understand that instead of describing the land as being in Range 13 East where the same lies, the deed described it as being in Range 13 West. This was only a typographical error and I know it was intended to convey the land in Range 13 East. I further know that neither Alabama Lime and Stone Corporation nor Southern Lime Corporation have any claim to said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 2, Township 24, Range 13 East, Shelby County, Alabama.
