Present, the Hon. W. L. Pratt Judge of Probate:

On the 27th day of July, 1923, this being the day heretofore appointed for hearing the application heretofore filed in this Court by Mrs. Margaret W. Morgan praying for the probate and record of a certain instrument of writing, purporting to be the last will and testament of S. J. Morgan of Blocton, Alabama, deceased, now comes Mrs. Margaret W. Morgan the said petitioner, and moves the Court that said application be granted; and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that notice of said application and the time for hearing the same has been duly given, in pursuance of law and the requirements of an order of this Court in the premises, entered on the 26th day of June, 1923, by notice duly served upon Mims W. Morgan, over the age of twenty-one years, and Mary Gray Morgan a minor over the age of eighteen years, both residents of Blocton, Bibb County, Alabama, and now, also S. D. Logan, heretofore appointed Guardian ad Litem to represent and defend the interest of Mary Gray Morgan, a minor and next of kin of the said deceased, in all matters relating to this application, coming into Court and consenting to act as said Guardian ad litem; now, on motion of the said Mrs. Margaret W. Morgan petitioner, the Court proceeds to hear said application. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, from the testimony of C. C. Morgan sign the said instrument in writing, purporting to be the last will and testament of said deceased, which instrument is now shown to them, on the day of the date thereof; that said instrument was then duly exhibited to them and that they heard the said S. J. Morgan then and there declare that the said instrument in writing was his last will and testament, and that they respectively subscribed their names as witnesses thereto, at the request of the said S. J.
