All in township seventeen (17) Range one (1) East, situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

That he simply lived on the place as a residence with his family and ~~home~~ of his sons and his family and cultivated the garden place or turnip patch; that he occupied part of this property in operating a shingle mill; he lived in the same residence until in January 1912 and in four or five days after he moved one of his mills' hands into the same house and is living there now; he has a lot fenced up in the same place in which his team has been staying ever since he began living on the place; he has been personally acquainted with this property for the past eight years and have always known it as belonging to S. F. Teague until Mr. Teague sold the property to Mr. C. E. Cole; that he has known of no one else claiming said land or the rights for the possession of the same; he built the above residence himself and moved into it immediately after it was finished; he has been cutting timber on all the different parts of the above land every since he has lived on it and still cuts it and has a contract to do so, which will expire on the 9th, of October 1912.
