I am acquainted with the NEt of SEt, Section 7, Township 21, South, Range 2 West, Shelby County, Alabama.

I have known this land for fifty years or more. My father, Wesley Ozley once owned the property and deeded it to C. B. Naish and wife, M. M. Naish, by deed dated February 15, 1911, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 50, at page 136.

Immediately upon the execution of the last mentioned deed said C. B. Naish and wife, M. M. Naish entered possession of the property and cultivated portions of it each and every year until about 10 years ago, and since then they have had portions of it fenced up and used as a pasture.

Said C. B. Naish and M. M. Naish, have been in the actual, open, notorious, exclusive, continuous, adverse, hostile possession of said property from February 15, 1911, down to the present time.

In the deed of my father to the Naishs, an exception is made as to a right of way of Saginaw Lime and Lumber Company, formerly known as Saginaw Lumber Company. This is a dinkey track which runs across the Northwest corner of the forty and leaves perhaps less than an acre of the forty just West and North of the dinkey track.

The track referred to runs in a Northeast and Southwest direction.
