AFFIDAVIT OF JAMES LEONARD LOVELADY

Affiant who being by me first duly sworn on oath deposes and says: My name is James Leonard Lovelady. I live on the Montevallo-Helena road in Shelby County, Alabama, and have lived there forty-five or forty-six years. I am seventy-four years of age and am familiar with the lands described as follows:

Beginning at the SW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, Township 21 South, Range 3 West; thence run North $87\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 580 feet to point on East side of Southern Railway Company's right of way; thence run in a Northerly direction along the East right of way line of said Southern Railway right of way a distance of 460 feet to a settlement road; thence run North $87\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East a distance of 557 feet to a point on West right of way line of Montevallo-Elyton road; thence run North $2\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East along West side of said road a distance of 285 feet to a point; run thence South 85 degrees West a distance of 1276 feet to the West line of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$; run thence South $2\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 804 feet to point of beginning, excepting Highway and Railroad rights of ways.

Part of NE_{4}^{1} , Section 32, Township 21 South, Range 3 West, described as follows: Begin at the SE corner of SE_{4}^{1} of NE_{4}^{1} of Section 32, Township 21, Range 3 West; thence run West along South boundary of such NE_{4}^{1} of said Section a distance of 1531.8 feet to a point; thence run North and parallel with the East boundary of said Section 32 for a distance of 1530 feet; thence run East and parallel with South boundary of such NE_{4}^{1} , for a distance of 1321.8 feet to the NW corner of Charles Henry Collins land; thence run South and parallel with East boundary of such Section 32, for a distance of 420 feet; thence run East 210 feet to East boundary of such Section 32; thence South along the East boundary of such Section 32, to point of beginning.

My father, William Solomon Lovelady, lived on a portion of the above described lands with his wife and my mother, Mary Lovelady. My father died around 1902 and my mother died in 1927. The children of my father and mother who were all living at his death were: W. Ezekial Lovelady, whose wife's name was Annie; Dora Lovelady, who married W. A. Lucas; Nannie Lovelady, who married one Bearden; E. T. Lovelady, whose wife's name was Molly; John F. Lovelady, whose wife's name is Blanche; and myself, whose wife's name was Myrtie. Of these the only ones now living besides myself are Annie Lovelady, and John F. Lovelady and his wife, Blanche.

I am familiar with a spur track that was owned by the

Montevallo-Dogwood Mining Company across the "Old John Cunningham Farm".

This spur track which is no longer used is north of the above described property and does not affect it and to my knowledge no other railway right of way or spur track crosses the above property with the exception of the Southern Railway Company's right of way.

I knew John Cunningham, the owner of the "Old John Cunningham Farm". It is my recollection that none of the children of John Cunningham lived on the "Old John Cunningham Farm" except Frank Cunningham who lived there a short time after his father died.
