AFFIDAVIT

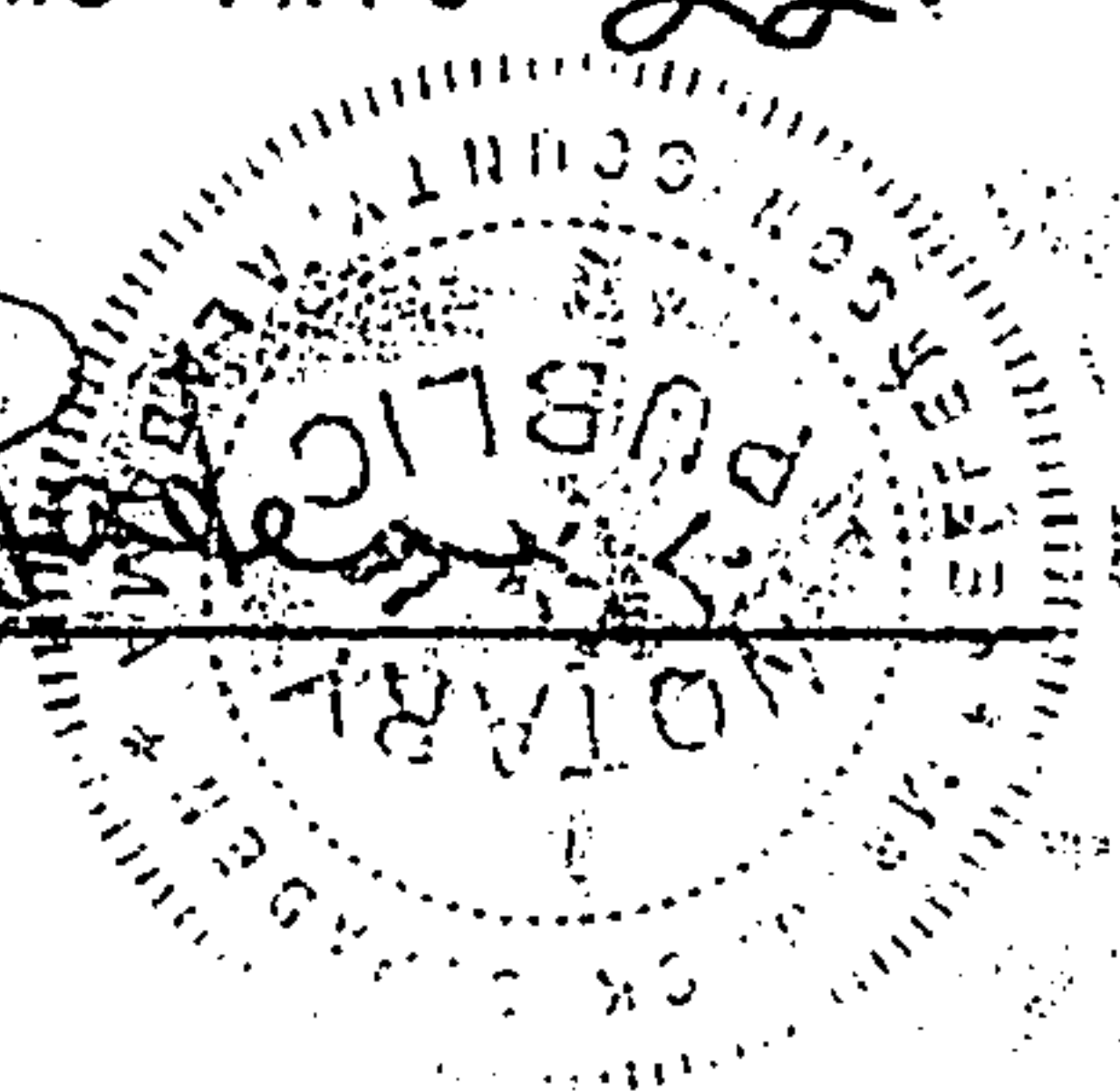
Before me, a Notary Public in and for said County in said State, personally appeared Willie Mae Hardy, now residing at 9010 9th Avenue, North, Birmingham, Alabama, who, being by me duly sworn, deposed and said:

When I was fifteen years old I came to Birmingham from Georgia. Shortly after I came to Birmingham I met Johnny Hardy and became his wife. He took me to his mother's home, where we lived for eight years. We lived there with his mother and his sister, Annie Johnson. This was in 1917. In September of 1918, John Wesley Hardy was born to us, and in 1923 Mildred Hardy was born. After we had lived together for eight years, Johnny Hardy became sick and unable to work. At this time I was offered a job as a servant to some white people and moved out of the house and lived on the premises with the white people in order to support my daughter, Mildred Hardy. Annie Johnson at this time was living in Shelby County and she took my son, John Wesley Hardy, to live with her. About a year after this my husband, Johnny Hardy, died. This was the only reason that we did not continue to live together until his death.
