His wife and three children named in his Will, went into possession of said property through teneants, having it cultivated each and every year until W. W. Robinson's heirsdeeded it to me by deed dated April 11, 1944, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 118, page 513. Said W. W. Robinson and the devisees under his will being his wife and three children, had the actual, open, notorious, exclusive, continuous, adverse possession of said property from Bebita 24, 1926 until they deeded it to me on April 11, 1944, and had it cultivated by tenants, who actually lived upon it during all that portions of time.

When I purchased this property from Robinson in 1944, it was rended as out and I went into possession of it about September 30, 1944, and how lived upon it continuously or had it cultivated continuously until I deeded to Clovinski Reynolds 4 acres in the Northwest corner of the SEt of SEt, Section 17, Township 19, Range 2 East, which deed is dated January 26, 1957, and recorded in the Probate Office of helby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 185, page 400, and during all that time I had the actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of said property.
