Shelby Iron Company deed to Paul Bean and Lorene Bean the $S_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $N_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $SW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of NE $_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, of said Section, and the 10 acres lying immediately West threof, by deed dated November 25, 1946, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 134, page 11, and the grantees went into possession of said twenty acre tract of land immediately upon the execution of the last mentioned deed, and have been in the actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse, hestile possession of the same continuously to the present time, living upon it and cultivating portions of it each and every year. In fact they had the land rented from Shelby Iron Company for 14 years before they procured the aforementioned deed, and during that time they lived upon it
