Before me, personally appeared A. P. Longshore, Sr., who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says:

I am 84 years of age. I lived in Shelby County, Alabama for approximately 39 years, from about the years 1885 to 1924. I was Probate Judge of said County from 1898 to 1916. I know and I am personally familiar with the location and boundaries of the property described in the deed from N. B. Mardis and wife to Joseph Vershott, dated August 26, 1892 and recorded in Deed Book 16 at page 377, Shelby County, Alabama. The reference to the name "Longshore" in said deed refers to my father, Levi Longshore, who owned property contiguous to and adjoining that conveyed in this said deed.

I know of my own personal knowledge that the cross fence referred to in said deed ran in a northerly direction from the southeast corner of the small tract known as the Alf Blake lot to an iron stake which marks a corner of the Dr. Williams property. This fence crossed the Town Branch in two places, striking said iron stake on the Northern bank at the second crossing of the creek.
