Personally came and appeared before me, S. A. Lokey a Notary Public for the State of Alabama at large, Elsie Little who after being by me first duly sworn according to law to speak the truth, deposeth and says:

My name is Elsie Little, I was formerlly Elsie Davis, daughter of Elijah Davis. I am well acquainted with the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 2, Township 22, Range 1 West in Shelby County, Alabama.

I know as a matter of family history that my father died just prior to my birth 51 years ago on the above described property. My mother continued to live on above described property and a few years later married one, Fress Ester and they continued to live there for several years, farming said land, pasturing pars, cutting wood from parts and in every way using it as a homestead and farm. After a few years they moved to Columbiana but the said Press Ester continued to cultivate the farm several years. Since then no one has farmed the land and it has grown up in timber and the said Press Ester cut wood from it from time to time and no one else has cut wood or in any way had control of any rart of said land. My mother died about the year 1934 and the said Fress Ester, her husband died about 1943.

My father, the said Elijah Davis had only 2 children to-wit: Major Davis and affiant. My mother only had one child by her second husband, a daughter whom they hamed Hattie Ester but who was commonly known as Hattie Davis, she was born three or four years after my father's death. She died in 1938 leaving no children or decedants of children surviving her and her husband died shortly after her death.

Since I can remember no one has been in possession of any part of the above described land except my mother and her husband, the said Fress Ester and their possession as above described was actual, exclusive, open, notorious, hostile peaceful, quite, under color of title and claim of ownership and no one else was ever in possession of any part of said land claiming adverse to the widow and heirs of my father,
