TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

I, William Gallon, a citizen of Shelby County, Alabama, make the following statement with reference to lands adjoining mine and which lands belonged to E. D. Holliday which he later sold to Henry W. Perry, Jr. and John P. Newsom fo Birmingham, Alabama. When I first moved into the vicinity of where I have since resided for some 32 years, Fess Alexander and his brother, Wiley Alexander, lived in the two houses on the Holliday lands where they engaged in farming, cutting timber from the land for lumber, crossties and mining props, and all timber manufactured by hand or machine by the Alexanders was hauled from the land by Mr.E. D. Holliday. The Alexanders were not equipped to do the hauling. The two houses on the Holliday land remained there until some 15 years after the Alexanders vacated them. I have today read the statement made this date by Fess Alexander and from my general knowledge of the conditions stated in his statement the same are correct and I have always regarded him to be a truthful person.
