


Before the undersigned authority personally appeared A. B. Bristow, who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says:

I am the owner of the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and $E\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$, Section 20, Township 21, Range 1 West, Shelby County, Alabama, and did own it on June 1, 1950, when Fred Horton and wife, Eloise Horton, executed a mortgage to B. L. Owen for the timber rights on the property. This timber, I sold to Fred Horton, and he borrowed the money from Mr. B. L. Owen to pay^{for} it. That was the only interest that Fred Horton ever had in the property, namely, the timber rights, which I sold him. In my deal with Fred Horton he had only twelve months within which to cut and remove the timber, which he did.

Preston A. Bristow, who on November 20th, 1948, executed a deed to me, is my son, and in this deed he conveyed to me the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and $E\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20, Township 21, Range 1 West, Shelby County, Alabama, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 137, page 310. At the time of the execution of the deed above referred to, my son, Preston A. Bristow was an unmarried man.
