I, L. C. Walker, Probate Judge in and for said County, in said State,
hereby certify that, this day came before me, Jack Davis, who, being by me
first duly sworn, deposes and saas as follows:

"My name is Jack Davis, and My wife is Mabel Davis. We went into
possession under a deed from Matildy Garner, or Matildy Norman, which said
deed was executed in the State of Oklahoma, where the grantor was then
residing, which said deed was executed under date of September 21st, 1942,
of the following described property, located in Shelby County, Alabama,
viz:

'The SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section seven(7), and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section
eight (8), and the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section
eight(8), in township 18, range 2 East of Huntsville Meridian,'

We paid to the said grantor the consideration named in said deed,
and went into immediate possession, and have resided on said lands, cultivating
parts of it, and selling the timber from the same, paying the taxes on
the same and claiming all of it as our very own, to this date. We have
never had anyone dispute our claim to ownership, or claim any interest in
the same adverse to ours. I knew the lands many years prior to our purchase
of the same, One Louie Garner and the said Matildy Garner went into possession
of said lands under a deed from T. H. Milam and wife, Mabel Milam, dated
August 25, 1916, and lived on it until Louie Garner's death, sometime in
the 1920's. The said Louie Garner's mother and father had both died before
he did, and he never had any brothers or sisters. His widow, the said Matildy
Garner, married a man by the name of 'Norman', within a few years after
Louie Garner's death. I do not know his first name or initials. I think
that the marriage was consummated in answer to an advertisement by one or the
other, for a companion. The said Matildy and Norman moved away to Oklakoma,
after a few years, and Norman died, after a rather lengthy illness. Matildy
wrote me that her husband had died, and that she owed a considerable bill
for his last sickness, and she desired to sell the land. After correspondence,
I purchased the said l nds for \$535.00, and wnet into possession, as aforesaid.
