Martin was a son, and there were several other children, and to my recollection, J. H. Martin divided his estate among his children prior to his death, and I know that in the division that was made that John B. Martin acquired the Not the NWA of the SE_4 and that Sally Hardwick acquired the S_2 of the above said forty. Later John B. Martin conveyed the No of said forty to W. A. Richey, and W. A. Richey immediately went into possession of said land and remained in possession of same until his death around the year 1928, and after his death, his wife, Mrs. W. A. Richey, or Drusilla Richey, and her children remained in possession of said property continuously until same was conveyed to Seabe Posey and Dal Posey around 15 or 16 years ago. They immediately went into possession of said property, built a hom on same and moved upon same with their family and läved

continuously on said property until they conveyed said property to Donald E. Richey and Sally Richey over 10 years ago. Donald E. Richey and wife, Sally Richey moved upon said property and have lived continuously on said property since same was conveyed to them by Seabe Posey and Dal Posey.

Sally Hardwick remained in the continous possession of the S_2^1 of the above said forty from the time when same was conveyed to her by her father, J. H. Martin, to her death which was to my recollection sometime after the year 1950. At the time of her death, she left surviving her as her sole surviving heirs at law Luciecate H. Scott, Mary H. Braden and Jimmy H. Hardwick. That after the death of Mrs. Hardwick, the above said heirs conveyed said property Donald Richey and wife, Sally Richey, and they have been in the continuous possession of said property to the present date.

I know of my own personal knowledge that Donald E. Richey and Sally M. Richey and their predecessors in title as set out in above have at all times since around the year 1914 been in the open, exclusive, adverse, notorious and peaceable possession of said property, and that during each of the respective periods of ownership, said owners have made certain improvements on said property, portions of said property have been farmed, the timber has been cut and removed from said property at various times, and other acts of ownership have been expressed over said property, and at no time have I ever heard the title to said property disputed.
