On September 23, 1939, Charles Hebb and wife, Viola
Hebb, Vernon Hebb and wife, Elianor Hebb, executed a qit
claim deed to Bertha Y. Hebb, which is recorded in the Probate
Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 107, page 95.
Both Charles Hebb and Vernon Hebb were my brothers. At the
execution of the
time of the/aforementioned deed Charles Hebb was a person of
sound mind. Later on about 5 years later he was adjudged
insane, but he was perfectly sane at the time he made that
deed.

My attention is called to a condemnation proceedings filed by Alabama Power Company on October 17, 1912, which is recorded in Final Record 7, page 41 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, and the land sought to be condemned is what is known as the Hebb Place on Coosa River. The then owners were stated to be G. V. Hebb, Sallie B. Hebb, G. V. Clinton. C. D. Hebb and Bertha Hebb. I was born on the Hebb place but later moved to Winston County. I have been familiar with the Hebb place all my life and I never heard of any G. V. Clinton being connected with the title to the property at all. Certain it is that no G. V. Clinton had any relationship whatsoever to any of the Hebb heirs, and so far as I have ever known no G. V. Clinton ever lived in that vicinity, and he certainly never lived on the Hebb property. Evidently the Alabama Power Company made an error in naming him as owner, because as stated no G. V. Clinton ever lived on the Hebb property.
