The Lees went into possession of said property immediately upon the execution of said deed and cultivated portims of it or had it cultivated by tenants each and every year until they sold and deeded it to T. F. Prestridge and wife, Alice Prestridge, by deed dated October 7, 1953, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 162, page 476, and during all that time they were in the actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse, hostile possession of said property, claiming to own it. No one else ever interposed any claim, right, or title to said property so long as the Lees ownedit.

Since T. F. Prestridge and wife obtained/to said property as aforesaid, they have been in the actual, open, notorious, exclusive, continuous, adverse, and hostile possession of same, claiming to own it, having part of it sowed in hay and the balance in pasture, and that kind of possession has continued to the present time.
