DECREE DISHIBSING CAUSE FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

THIS CAUSE, having heretofore been specially set, duly came on to be called for bearing and trial before a jury this 15th day of June, 1959, at 10:00 o'clock a. m., at which time the complainant appeared by her solicitors, the firm of Parsons, Wheeler & Rose, and Malcolm Wheeler, Esq., of that firm. The respondents appearing by their solicitors, the firm of Parsons, and James C. Barton, Esq. Respondent Ada Parker also appeared in her own proper person.

Upon the calling of the case, respondents amnounced "ready", and complainant's counsel moved for a continuence, to which motion respondents objected. The case has twice been set upon the calendar for trial with additional veniremen summoned for service in the Equity Division to eccomplaine the jury domand. Each time it was continued at the complainant's instance, the last continuence having been May 4, 1959, at which time the Court informed counsel that it would not be disposed to again pass the case which has been pending for more than three years.

In the absence of affidavits or other sworn showing of some specific reason why complement cannot attend the trial, or submit her deposition, or otherwise proceed to offer testimony in support of her

continuence should be, and it hereby is, denied, and complainant excepts.

Complainant filed in open Court a motion to withdraw the jury demand, which was granted by order endorsed at the foot thereof.

Thereupon respondents proceeded to open the proof under <u>Smith vs.</u>

<u>Brynnt</u>, \$2 So. (24), \$11, by making proof of the probate of the will, and equicil therete.

/ whereupon the Court inquired whether complainant had any evidentiary matter to offer in support of the contest, and being informed that there was no evidence to be offered, the Court is of the opinion that the cause should be, and it hereby is, dismissed for want of procecution upon complainant's failure to produce any proof in support of the bill of complaint.

It is, therefore, ORCERED and DECREED by the Court that this was be, and hereby is, dismissed, and the costs thereof taxed against the complainant H. Allene Parker, for which les execution issue.
