for and in consideration of the sum of one <sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub> \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars

(\$ 1.00) to ME in hand paid by Alabama Power Company, a corporation, the receipt whereof is acknowledged, do hereby grant to said Alabama Power Company, its successors and assigns, the right to construct, operate and maintain its lines of poles and towers and appliances necessary in connection therewith, as located by the final location survey heretofore made by said Company, for the transmission of electric power with the right to string thereon from time to time electric power and telephone wires and the right to permit other corporations and persons to attach wires to said poles and towers upon, over, under and across the following described lands situated in Shelby County, Alabama:

commence at the NW corner of SE 1/4 of SW 1/4 of Sec. 1,  
Tp. 21, R. 3 W and run south 210 feet; thence run east 300  
feet to point of beginning; thence run south 100 feet;  
thence run east 159.6 ft; thence run northerly 109 feet;  
thence run westerly 150 feet more or less to point of  
beginning.

In the event it becomes necessary or desirable for Alabama Power Company to move its lines of poles, towers and appliances in connection with the construction or improvement of any public road or highway in proximity to its said power lines, the said Company is hereby granted the right to relocate its said lines of poles, towers, and appliances on lands of grantors hereinabove described, provided, however, the said Company shall relocate its said line of poles or towers at a distance not greater than ten feet outside the boundary of the right of way of any such public road or highway as established or re-established from time to time.

Together with all the rights and privileges necessary or convenient for the full enjoyment or use thereof, including the right of ingress and egress to and from said lines; and also the right to cut and keep clear all trees, and to keep clear other obstructions, that may injure or endanger said lines.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same to the said Company, its successors and assigns, forever.
