Jack D. Philips and wife, Marcello M. Phillips

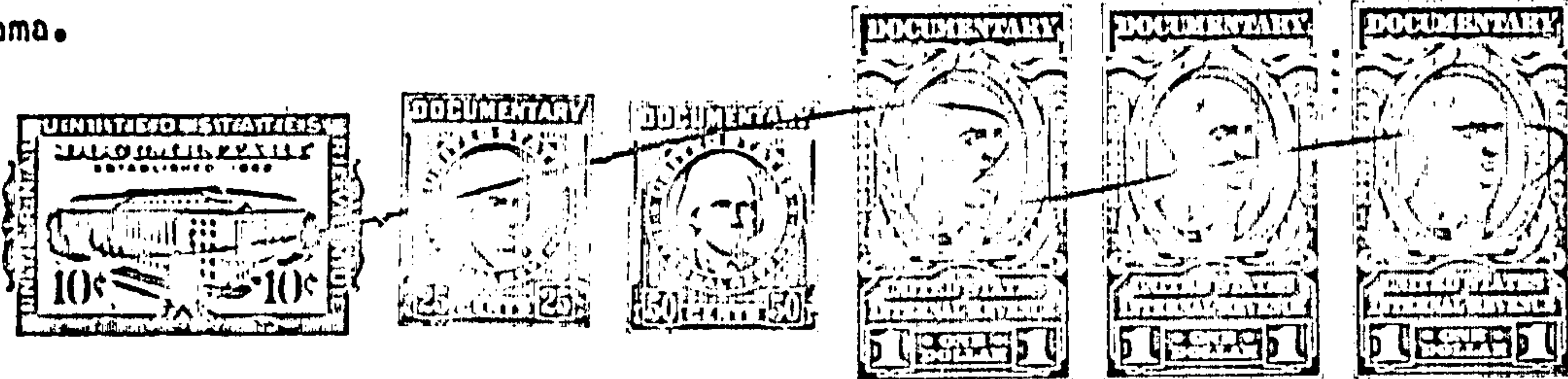
(herein referred to as GRANTEES) for and during their joint lives and upon the death of either of them, then to the survivor
