Hwy #25; thence run Southwesterly along the South boundary of said paved highway to a point where the same intersects the East boundary of a county road connecting the old and new Ala. Hwy #25; thence Southerly along the East boundary of said connecting road to its intersection with the North right of way line of new location of Ala. Hwy #25; thence Easterly along said right of way to its intersection with the East boundary of said SEA of NWA; thence Wortherly along the East boundary of said Quarter Quarter Section to point of beginning.

Collum, who immediately started to build a house on the property and moved in the house and lived there for several years, and after that time, he rented the house out, and is renting the same as of this date, the same being situated on the North side of the above described property.

Affiant further says that he has lived next to this property since he moved to Calera, and knows that there has been no dispute as to the lines and that no one, to his knowledge, has ever questioned the title of Ralph L. Collum.

Further deposing, affiant further says that Ralph L. Collum bought a certain portion of the above described land from Joel E. Green and wife, Mae Green

Jackson and his family lived on that land and that when Mr. Jackson died, it was sold by his heirs; and knows that later the land was bought by Ralph L. Collum, who is in possession of the same at this time.
