Before me, the undersigned, a Notary Public in and for said County in said State personally appeared Brewton Bentley, who being first duly sworn deposes and says as follows:

That he has resided in Shelby County, Alabama, for a period exceeding seventy years and that he is well acquainted with J. T. Crenshaw, who died August 28, 1963, and his widow, Roxie Crenshaw, and that J. T. Crenshaw and wife, Roxie Crenshaw, did reside on the property described herein continuously from well before February of 1927 until some time in 1961, and that J. T. Crenshaw did occupy the property openly and hostilely and claimed it as his own against the entire world, and no one ever disputed the title to the following described property as being in any one other than J. T. Crenshaw, which property is situated in Shelby County, Alabama, and is described as follows:

The S $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, except $\frac{1}{2}$ acre in SW corner;

The NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$, except 5 acres in SW corner described as follows: Commence at the SW corner and run North to creek; thence down the creek to a small gum; thence East to the old road; thence South to South line of said forty; thence West along South line to point of beginning of said exception.

Surface right only to NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and to S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, minerals and mining rights excepted as to this 60 acres.

All of the above described property is located in Section 24, Township 20 South, Range 1 West, Shelby County, Alabama.

That he knew Sarah J. Crenshaw and Joe M. Crenshaw, who was also known as J. M. Crenshaw, who were the parents of J. T. Crenshaw, and that when Sarah J. Crenshaw died she left surviving her the only children who survived infancy who were her children J. T. Crenshaw, her son, Emma Cabaniss, her daughter, who was married to T. J. Cabaniss during the year 1919, and Louisa Horton, her daughter, who was married to B. H. Horton during the year 1921. That Sarah J. Crenshaw had no other children who predeceased her leaving any surviving children.

That he knew Hester L. Crenshaw, the first wife of J. T. Crenshaw, and that during her life Sarah Crenshaw had born to her only two children who survived infancy, of which children were living on the 19th of November of 1955 and who were Audrey Crenshaw Driggers, who was married to Tom Driggers, and her son, Vernon T. Crenshaw, who was married to Lena Mae Crenshaw.
