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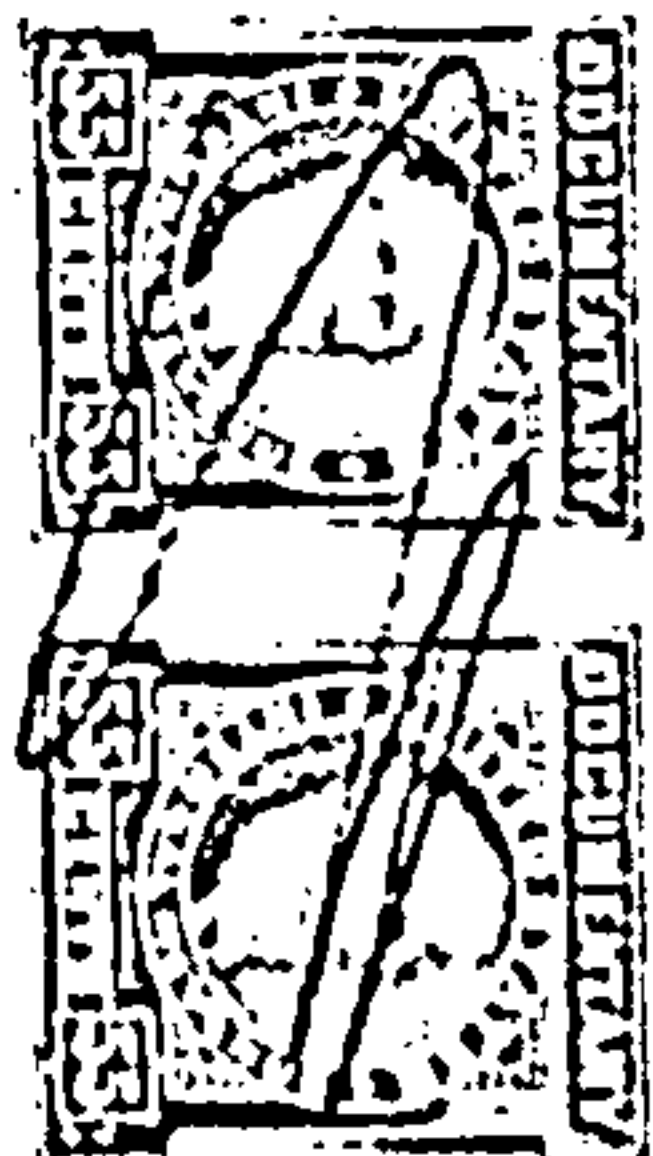

WITNESSETH, That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00), in hand paid to them by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, the following described real property, situate, lying and being in the County of Shelby, State of Alabama, to wit:

Begin at the Southwest Corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 5, Township 18, Range 2 East; thence 1320 feet to the Southeast Corner of said forty acres; thence North 330 feet to the intersection of South Right-of-Way of Shelby County Highway No. 43; thence in a Southwesterly direction along said Highway Right-of-Way to the intersection of the West boundary line of said forty acres; thence South 189 feet to the starting point.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the said above described real estate, unto the said Oscar Ferrell Fincher and wife, Mary Ann Fincher, party of the second part, and unto their heirs and assigns forever.

We, the party of the first part, do for ourselves, and our heirs, executors, and administrators, covenant with the said Oscar Ferrell Fincher and wife, Mary Ann Fincher, the party of the second part, and unto their heirs and assigns, that we, the party of the first part are lawfully seized in fee simple of said premises; that said premises are free from all encumbrances; that we, the party of the first part, have a good right to sell and convey the same, as aforesaid; that we, the party of the first part, will and our heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said



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heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims of all persons.
