Bowles, Sr. also known as Charles Alfred Bowles, and his wife, Isla J. Bowles, both of whom died intestate. C. A. Bowles, Sr. died on January 17, 1918 and Isla Bowles died on November 3, 1936. They left as their sole heir, affiant, he being the son of said persons. Affiant further says Isla Bowles was one and the same as Isla J. Bowles and Mrs. C. A. Bowles and was a daughter of A. H. Averyt. It is called to affiant's attention a Tax Sale in the name Mrs. Ellen G. Stoughton, Isla A. Bowles, Agent, which property was purchased by Mrs. C. A. Bowles and which sale was had on the 8th day of June, 1936, and is recorded in Tax Sale Record 12, page 281 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama. Affiant says Isla A. Bowles and Ers. C. A. Bowles are one and the same person. Affiant further says that Helen A. Averyt who owned Lot 5 Block 60 according to Safford's map of Shelby, which is recorded in Map Book 3 pages 38 and 47 in said Probate Office, was the sister of Isla A. Bowles and was affiant's aunt and that the said Helen A. Averyt willed said lot to affiant at her death.

Affiant further says Ellen L. Stoughton, being one and the same person of an aunt D. as Ellen G. Stoughton, was the wife of H. R. Stoughton, and she was C. A. Bowles, Sr. and the condition in

Affiant further says C. A. Bowles, Sr. left a will under which he willed all his property to Isla Bowles and upon the death of C. A. Bowles, Sr. in 1918, the said Isla Bowles went into immediate possession of the same, looked after it, cared for it and treated it as her own until she made certain conveyances as shown by deeds recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama. I'rs. Bowles actually lived twey from the property, but had her sister, Helen Alice. Averyt, who livel in Shelby, Mabama, to look after the property for her; that upon the death of Helon Alice Averyt, affiant was willed certain lots as shown by the Will recorded in Deed Book 171 page 96 in spid Probate Office. Immediately thereafter, affiant designated Charles H. Thornburg of Shelby to look after all of the land which he had inherited as mentioned above, the same being hereinafter. described. The said Charles H. Thornburg was to look after said property for as to keep trespossers off and to keep persons from unlawfully cutting the timber.
