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Before me, the undersigned authority in and for said County in said State, personally appeared Willis H. Moore, who, after being by me first duly sworn to speak the truth, depose a and says:

My name is Willis H. Moore, lam 57 years of age and have lived in Shelby County, Alabama, all of my life and have lived wit in 15 miles of the following described land:

SEL of NWL of Section 14, Township 21, Range 1 West, Shelby County, Alabama.

When I was a child and first remember said forty acres, it was a part of the land owned by J. H. Milner and he used and occupied the same as a farm and it was generally known around Columbiana as the "Goat Farm". The Columbiana-Chelsen paved road runs pretty generally where the old Columbiana-Chelsen dirt road ran in this area and I distinctly recall Mr. Milner had that part west of the road fenced in and this, of course, included the north line of the ·above described 40 acres and the fence ran along the westerly side of the road and Mr. Milner kept goats and other animals in the pasture. I certainly could remember it as far back as 1915 and this was the condition then and said land e continued to be fenced in until after hr. Milner sold it in 1922 and right on up through the different owners of the land until I purchased it and there was:a. fence on it when I purchased it from J. E. Embry and wife in 1957, as shown by deed recorded in Deed Bock 189 page 282 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama. The fence was along the north line of said 40 acres and along the west side of said road when I purcha ad it, although it was not in good repair at that time. Not long after 1 purchased the land 1 cleared the same and have not maintained the fence since I purchased it, but I know that for more than 40 years said land was under fence, including the one acre off the northwest corner e of said forty acres and it was in the possession of J. M. Milner and his riccessors in title throughout the years to the present date and I have never heard of anyone. making any claim to said one acre off the northwest corner and never knew there was any question about the one acre until I saw it in the abstract a few years ago. No one has ever questioned my entire ownership of said 40 acres of land. in 1950 J. E. Embry assessed said one acre parcel off the northwest corner of SEL of NWL of said Section 14 in the name "Owner Unknown" and let the same sell for taxes and he bought it in at the Tax Sale. This sale covered the years 1945 through 1950. Through some error the property was not taken off the assessment records in the name "Owner Unknown" and was sold again for taxes for the

years 1947 through 1950. James Hollis williams purchased the State's interest in this particular sale; however, this was clearly a duplicate and error ous tax sale as the prior sale had been for the same years. Sometime thereafter Mr. Williams came to me and told me he had bought the land at a Tax Sale and asked if I wanted to pay him for his interest in it. I told him he did not own any interest in it and I would not pay him anything. Sometime after that Mr J. E. Embry showed me an affidavit signed by J. H. Williams to the effect J. H. Williams made no claim to said one acre of land by tax sale or otherwise. I thought this affidavit was on record. I know James Hollis williams lived in Chilton County and I know he has never assessed or exercised any act of ownership on said land. And, as mentioned above, the actual owners have had the same under fence and in their possession since 1915 to my knowledge. Affiant further says that the said J. E. Embry, affiant and Lewis B. Walker have assessed the property each and every year for more than the past 15 years and no other person has assessed the same during this time.
