BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, a Notary Public in and for said County in said State, personally appeared E. L. GIBSON, who, after being duly sworn by me to speak the truth deposes and says as follows:

My name is E. L. GIBSON and I am 73 years of age. I have been familiar with the occupation, use, and possession of the hereinafter described real estate since the year 1944 and have resided in the neighborhood of said property since that date, to-wit:

The E½ of SW¼ of NE¼, Section 19, Township 21, Range 1 East, SE¼ of NE¾; and part of NE¾ of SE¾ of Section 19, Township 21, Range 1 East described as follows: Begin at point on East and West median line of said Section 19, which point is 450 feet West of the East boundary line of Section and run in a Southeasterly direction 300 feet, more or less, to a point on the North side of Mardis Ferry Road, which point is 426 feet measuring along the road in Westerly direction from its intersection with East line of Section; thence Northeasterly along road 426 feet more or less to Eæt line of Section, thence North along East line of Section to NE corner of NE¾ of SE¼; thence West along North line of above forty to point of beginning, containing 1½ acres, more or less.

At the time I first remember the above described property in 1944, it was owned by Mrs. Lillie Mae McKnight, and on June 19, 1944, by Deed recorded in Deed Book 116, page 463 in the Probate Records of Shelby County, Alabama, I purchased a part of the NE% of the SE% of Section 19, Township 21, Range 1 East. By mistake, that portion of the above described property which is located in the last mentioned was a Section/included in my deed. Subsequently, on April 17, 1945, by deed recorded in Deed Book 122, page 63, I reconveyed the 12 acres, more or less, described above as being in the 🖟 ¼ Section to Mrs. Lillie Nae McKnight. On October 6. 1945. by deed recorded in Deed Book 122, page 156 in the Probate Records of Shelby County, Mrs. Lillie Mae McKnight conveyed the above described property to Rosco e Alabama, Immediately after the execution of this last mentioned deed said Roscoe Weems Weems. went into the actual, adverse, open, notorious, hostile, and adverse possession of said above described property and moved into the residence located thereon. For each and every year up until October 14, 1950, said Roscoe Weems lived in the residence located thereon and cultivated a portion of said property. Part of the property was used by Roscoe Weems as a pasture and the remaining part was in timber. On October 14, 1950, the above described property was conveyed to C. S. Hines and wife Jettie Florence Hines by deed recorded in Deed Book 140, page 526, in the Probate Records of Shelby County, Alabama. Immediately after the execution of the last mentioned dedd

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in favor of C. S. Hines and wife, Mr. and Mrs. Hines went into the actual, adverse, hestile, open, notorious, continuous and exclusive adverse possession of said property and moved into the residence located thereon. Mr. and Mrs. Hines used part of the above described property for pasture and cultivated a part thereof, the balance being left in timber. On June 5, 1956, by deed recorded in Deed Book 181, page 44, in the Probate Records of Shelby County, Alabama, the above described property was conveyed by Mr. and Mrs. Hines to S. G. Weeks and wife, Clarice P. Weeks. Immediately after the execution of this last mentioned deed Mr. and Mrs. Weeks went into the actual, open. hostile, notorious, continuous, exclusive and adverse possession of the said property and moved into the residence located thereon. Mr. and Mrs. Weeks lived on said property and used a part thereof for pasture up to and including the date of this affidavit. Approximately two years ago Mr. and Mrs. Weeks fenced the above described property by fence on all boundaries thereof which said fence remains as of the date of this affidavit. During the more than 20 years I have known the occupation, use, and possession of the above described property it has been in the actual, open, hostile, notorious, continuous, exclusive and adverse possession of S. G. Weeks and Clarice P. Weeks, and their predecessors in title as aforesaid and no other person, firm, or corporation has been in possession of said property or any part thereof or asserted any right, claim, title, or interest therein.
