This day personally appeared before me, the undersigned authority, a Notary Public in and for said County in said State, Lucy Jane Bailey, known to me, who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

I am over the age of 21 years and am a resident of Shelby County, Alabama. My father was Z. R. Bailey and my mother was Mary Jane Killingsworth Bailey (also known as Mary Jane Bailey). My father predeceased my mother, who never remarried and died on or about March 6, 1932. Her will is recorded in Will Book 4, page 2, in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama. My said mother, Mary Jane Killingsworth Bailey, was survived by the following named six children (and by no descendants of deceased children), which six children constituted the sole heirs at law and next of kin of said Mary Jane Killingsworth Bailey and Z. R. Bailey:

1. Florence Bailey Long
2. Rubye Bailey Harper
3. Lena Bailey Lowery
4. Charles D. Bailey
5. Clemmie (or Clem) Bailey Seale
6. Lucy Jane Bailey (the affiant).

In addition, said Mary Jane Killingsworth Bailey was also survived by Morris Bailey, who was reared by said Mary Jane Killingsworth Bailey and treated as a son by her, though not legally adopted by her.

Of the six children listed above who survived said Mary Jane Killingsworth Bailey, the following named three have died and their heirs or devisees are as follows:

1. Charles D. Bailey died in Dadeville, Alabama, on May 14, 1966, survived by no widow and by no descendants, and his will is of record in Will Book 16, page 289, in said Probate Office of ~~SE~~ SHELBY COUNTY, ALA., which will devises all of the testator's interest in the land described below to said Morris Bailey, referred to above. No contest of said will of Charles D. Bailey has been filed, and to my knowledge no grounds for any such contest exist.

2. Florence Bailey Long, died in Montgomery, Alabama, while resident of Calera, Shelby County, Alabama, on June, 1959, intestate, survived only by her two children, G. C. Long (whose wife is Sylvia Long) and Helen Long Thompson (whose husband is Richard A. Thompson). Said Florence Bailey Long's husband predeceased her, she never remarried after death of second husband, and she was survived by no other children than the two mentioned above nor by any descendants of deceased children.

3. Clemmie (or Clem) Bailey Seale, died in Selma, Alabama in 1956, intestate, survived by her five children, Alliene Sherrer (whose husband is Edgar Sherrer), Frances Seale Hughes (whose husband is B. M. Hughes), Walter Seale (whose wife is Mildred Seale), Robert Earl Seale (whose wife is Helen Seale) and Lawrence L. Seale, who died, testate, in Selma, Alabama and whose will, dated January 30, 1958, appears of record in Will Book No. 18, at page 457, of the Probate Records of Dallas County, Alabama. Said Clemmie Bailey Seale was survived by no other children than the five mentioned above nor by any descendants of deceased children.

All of the matters set forth in this affidavit are personally known to me by virtue of my family relationship with the persons referred to herein. This affidavit is made for the purpose of inducing Martin Marietta Corporation to purchase from
