NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

I, John A. King, Jr., who after being duly sworn depose as follows:

That my Grandmother, Fannie A. Baker did die on towit: 8th day of June, 1921 and that at her death she did leave a will which was recorded in Office of Judge of Probate, Etowah County, Alabama and according to said will the hereinafter described land was left to my mother, Lila B. King during her lifetime and at her death it was then to go to the then surviving children of Lila B. King that Lila B. King did die April 23, 1964 in Etowah County, Alabama and at her death there was surviving her John A. King, Jr., son and affiant, Robert H. King, Attorney a son and Eleanor Gary Johns a daughter, Gadsden, Alabama. There were no other surviving children, all other brothers and sister having died within three years after their birth. There are no other surviving heirs at law other than the three above mentioned children.

That my said brother, Robert H. King and my said sister, Eleanor Gary Johns made me a quit claim deed of their one-third interest of the hereinafter described land, said quit claim deed is a matter of record in the Office of Probate, Shelby County, Alabama, that after the death of my said Grandmother said land hereinafter described was sold for taxes in the year 1926 to the State of Alabama and thence from the State of Alabama to an individual named Harrison whose son was Karl Harrison, and thence to other people whose names I do not recall but will be a matter of record. Said land that my said Grandmother purchased and acquired is described as follows:

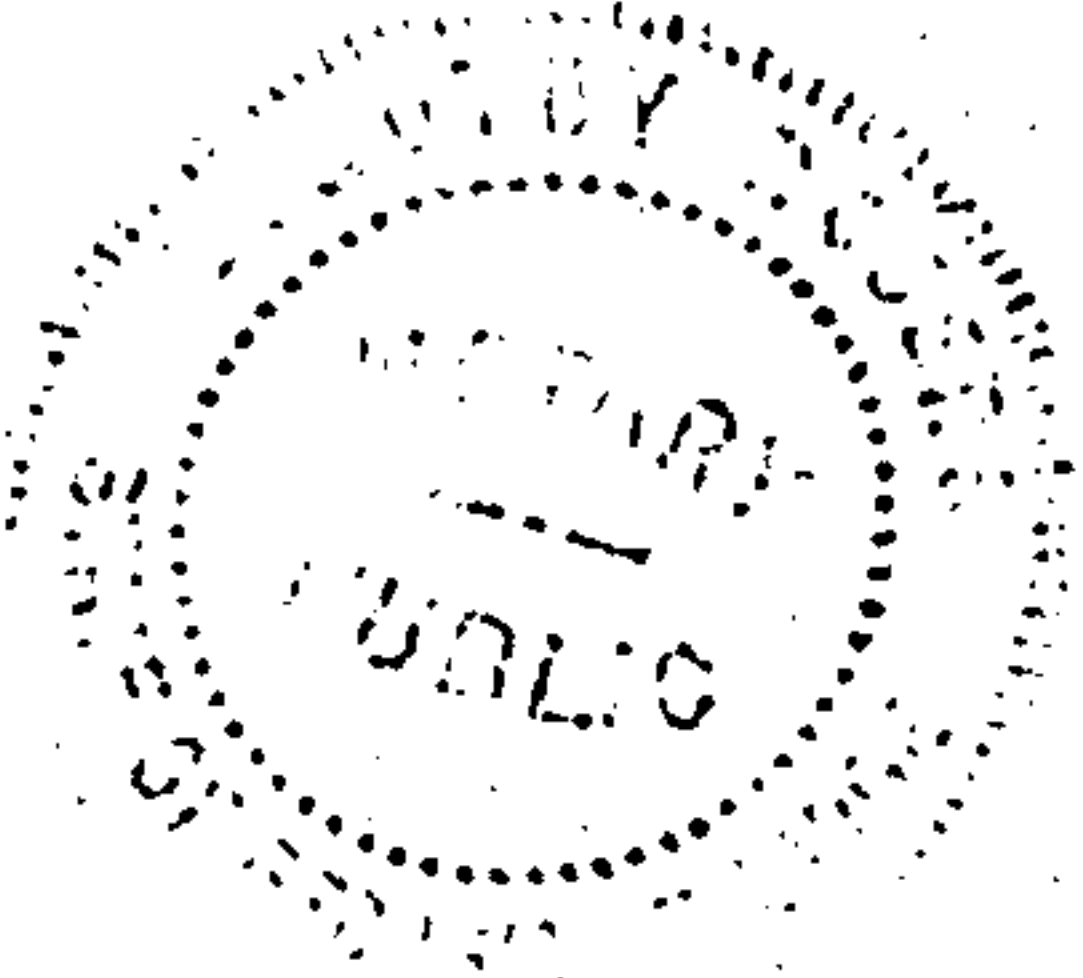
