My name is Ozelle Eruner. I recall when my husband, R. J. Bruner along with other land purchased the hereinefter described lot/from Venie Walker, my Mother, in 1944.

Said lot being described as follows:

regin at the point where the southeastern boundary of May Street intersects with the northeastern boundary of Pinc Street and run in a southeasterly direction along caid boundary of said Pine Street for a distance of 179.40 feet to the point of beginning; thence continue along the same said course for a distance of 142.97 feet to a point on the southerly right of way line of County Road No. 55; thence turn an angle of 160 deg. 14 min. to the left in a northwesterly direction along the right of way line of said County Road No. 55 for a distance of 151.92 feet; thence turn an angle of 109 deg. 46 min. to the left and parallel to May Street for a distance of 51.33 feet to the point of beginning; being situated in the Swi of Swi of Section 19. Township 18, Range 2 lest, Shelby County, Alabama.

R. J. Fruner went into immediate possession of the lot, along with other land, pall taxes on it each and every year. He also obtained deeds from the heirs of R. C. McClinton, deceased. We continued in the actual possession of the lot, along with other land until we sold the same to C.C. Goodwin and wife in clober, 1952, along with other land. Mr. Goodwin built a brick house on land adjoining the above lot and sold off portions of the land he purchased and sold the above lot to James A. and Irene Johnson on June 28, 1954, as shown by deed recorded in Deed Book 167 page 263 in said Probate Office. The Johnsons went into immediate possession of the lot, paid taxes on it each and every year and held the same adversely against all the world. The above lot is bounded by the County pavel road on the northeasterly; by Pine Street on the southwesterly side and by a lot formerly owned by hatert Dafton Johnson on the northmost side, the same is a triangular shaped lot. During all the years I have known said property I have never heard of anyone contesting the title or disputing the possession of James A. and Irene Johnson and their predecessors in title.
