Before me, the undersigned authority in and for said County, in
being one and the same as Willie B. Smith
said State, personally appeared Willie Edna Boothe Smith, who, after being by
me first duly sworn to speak the truth, deposes and says:

My name is Willie Edna Boothe Smith. I am 53 years of age and am
familiar with the following described land:

Commence at the NW corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15,
Township 12 South, Range 2 East, thence run East along the North
line of said Section, a distance of 421.02 feet; thence turn an
angle of 94 deg. 37 min. to the right and run a distance of 39.28
feet to the South Right-of-way line of a Fowl County Highway, and
the point of beginning; thence continue in the same direction a
distance of 132.16 feet; thence turn an angle of 25 deg. 46 min.
to the left and run a distance of 225.34 feet; thence turn an angle
of 57 deg. 22 min. to the left and run a distance of 162.92 feet
to the South Right-of-way line of said County Highway; thence turn
an angle of 26 deg. 52 min. to the left and run along said Right-
of-way line, a distance of 232.52 feet to the point of beginning.
Situated in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, Township 12 South,
Range 2 East, Shelby County, Alabama.

The above described land was surveyed by Frank A. Wheeler on May
11, 1966.

I know of my own knowledge that the property as described above is
the same property which I inherited by Will from O. C. Boothe and which has
heretofore been described as shown in the foregoing affidavit of Richard T.
McGraw.

I first remember said land when it was in the possession of Mrs. J. T.
Pann, who was the widow of Dr. J. T. Pann and she lived in the dwelling house
situated on the lot and she continued to live there until her death. The heirs
then sold said land to R. M. Denty and he took possession of the property and rented
it out during the time he owned it and until he sold it to my father, O. C. Boothe.
The said O. C. Boothe lived in said dwelling house until his death and after that
his widow, my Mother and I lived there until her death in 1966. I continued to
live in said dwelling house until the storm destroyed it in 1967. Since that
time I moved away, but I am now in the process of rebuilding on said lot.

There has been called to my attention a petition in the estate of O. C.
Boothe in which Birdie Boothe was named as the widow and affiant, Willie Edna
Boothe Smith, as one daughter. There was also one son, O. C. Boothe, Jr. who
was served notice in connection with the Will hearing.

Affiant says as far back as she can remember there has been a fence between their land and the Poole lot being the west line of the lot described above. The lot is bordered on the south by the school lot and on the east by the school and there is an old fence between the school and my lot. The north line is bordered by the paved road.

With reference to the affidavit recorded on Deed Book 212 page 225 in the Probate Office, the line referred to therein is the line separating my lot from the J. J. Poole, Jr. lot and it is the same as was established many years ago and the line remains the same.
