Before me, the undersigned Authority, in and for said County in said State, personally appeared Annie Bain, who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says on oath that she the said Affiant is a daughter of William M. Bain, who died on May 10, 1931; that Affiant is familiar with that certain real property described as the East Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (E $\frac{1}{2}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 26, Township 19, South, Range 3, West, which is a 20 acre tract of land near Acton and Alabama. Affiant says that Affiant's Father, William M. Bain owned said property at one time, and made an exchange with Acton Mining Company, whereby he conveyed the above described property, and received therefor another tract known as the West half of the Northwest Quarter of Northwest Quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section 25, Township 19, South, Range 3, West. This exchange was made around 1905. Years after this, Affiant's Brother, Samuel F. Bain took possession of the land, began assessing and paying taxes thereon, and claimed the property as his own. He later sold the property to B.A. Chace and F.A. Chace. At the time Affiant's Father, William M. Bain died, he did not own said property first above described.
