There has been called to my attention the description in the deed, which description is erroneous. We purchased 4 acres of land in the northeast corner of the NE2 of NE2 of Section 16, Township 21, Range 3 West, which should have been described as follows:

Begin at the northeast corner of NE₄ of NE₄ of Section 16, Township 21, Range 3 West, and run thence south along the east line of said quarter-quarter section a distance of 140 yards; thence west and parallel with the north line of said quarter-quarter section a distance of 140 yards; thence north and parallel with the east line of said quarter-quarter section 140 yards; thence east along the north line of said quarter-quarter section 140 yards to the point of beginning; situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

My mother, Mrs. Nellie Holsomback is dead, she having died without leaving a Will and the other persons named in the deed were her sole and surviving heirs at law. Neither I nor any of my brothers and sisters have ever made any claim to any land in the NE4 of NE4 of said Section 16, except for that described above, but we have been in possession of said 4 acres continuously since we purchased the same and have paid taxes and held the same adversely.
