## AFFIDAVIT

Before me, Dorthy D. Keyes, a Notary Public, State at Large, in and for said County and State appeared John J. Keyes, Sr. and Bessie B. Kirchler, who upon being duly sworn to speak the truth deposeth and saith:

Our Grandfather, James O'Neill, was born in Ireland about the year 1837. He became a naturalized citizen of the United States in 1858, in Shelby County, Alabama. He enlisted in the army of the Confederate States of America on April 12, 1862, at Montevallo. Alabama and served with the infantry in Company D, 44th Alabama Infantry Regiment as a private during the War Between The States. He served at Manassas, Chichamauga. Raccon Mountain, Knoxville, Dandridge and was wounded in the battle of the Wilderness, on May 6, 1864.

He married Bridget Brennan O'Neill in Ireland before emigrating to America. They had the following children: Louisa; Patrick H.; Mary Anne; William, and Dan. Louisa married first, James McGovern, second, Michael Joseph Keyes; Patrick H. O'Neill (Bud) died a single man never having married, and without issue before World War II. Mary Anne married Alois Kirchler; William married Elizabeth Monroe O'Neill; Dan died as a child, never married and died without issue.

Louisa O'Neill married James McGovern and they had a child Annie. Mr. McGovern died leaving surviving him Louisa, his widow, and Annie, his child; there were all of his heirs at law, including child or children of deceased children.

Louisa O'Neill McGovern married Michael Joseph Keyes, after the death of her first husband. James McGovern, and they had two children: John James Keyes, Sr. a/k/a "Jimmy" Keyes; and Marguerite Keyes, a/k/a "Maggie". Michael Joseph Keyes was sometimes known as Michael Joseph Keys and M. J. Keyes, as well as "Uncle Mike". Louisa O'Neill McGovern Keyes was affectionately known as "Aunt Lou". John James Keyes. Sr. married Helen Jane O'Hare and they had five children one of whom died at birth; the oldest was James Keyes, who died at the age of only a few weeks. John James Keyes, Jr. a/k/a "Jack"; Michael Joseph Keyes a/k/a "Mike" Keyes and Mary Theresa Keyes. Mary Theresa Keyes died at the age of sixteen on June 2, 1946, without ever marrying. At the date of this affidavit, both John James Keyes, Sr. and Marguerite Keyes are living. Marguerite Keyes married Sebastian Watts and they have one child James Keyes Watts, a/k/a "Jim" Watts.

Mary Anne O'Neill married Alois Kirchler. We incoporate into this affidavit that of John Alois Patrick Kirchler, dated November 2, 1965, a certified copy of which is attached hereto, marked Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by this reference as fully as if set out in full. John Alois Patrick Kirchler has died and his will is on record in volume 258, page 510, Judge of Probate's office Shelby County, Alabama; and volume 92, page 864, Judge of Probate's office, Jefferson County, Alabama. The only survivors of Mary Anne O'Neill Kirchler are Annie Theresa Kirchler and Elizabeth Bridget Kirchler a/k/a "Bessie" Kirchler, who are living at this date.

William O'Neill and his wife Elizabeth Nora Monroe O'Neill had thirteen children. We attach hereto and incoporate herein by this reference as fully as if set out in full detail a copy of our affidavit dated August 1, 1969, which is marked Exhibit B hereto.
