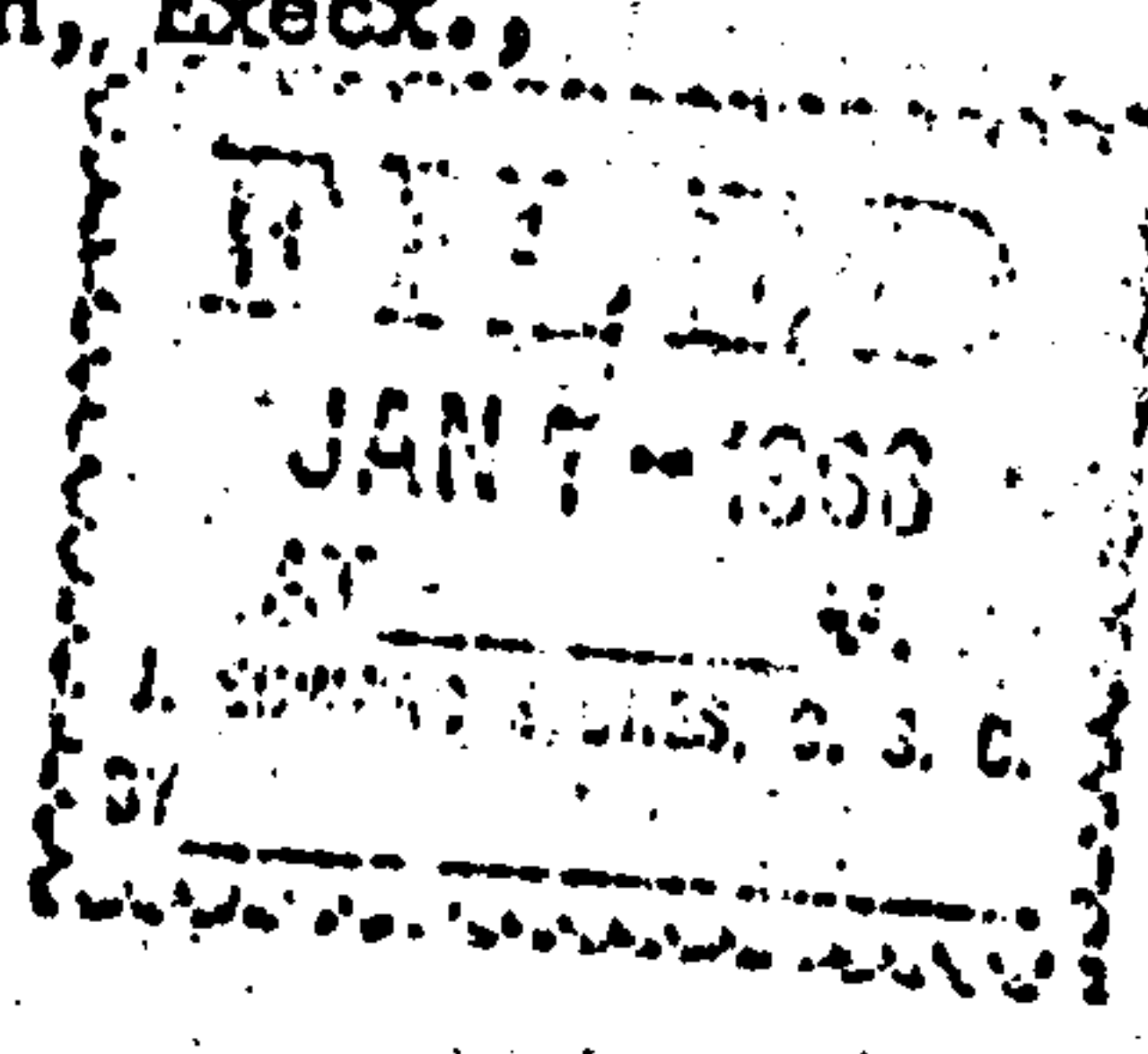

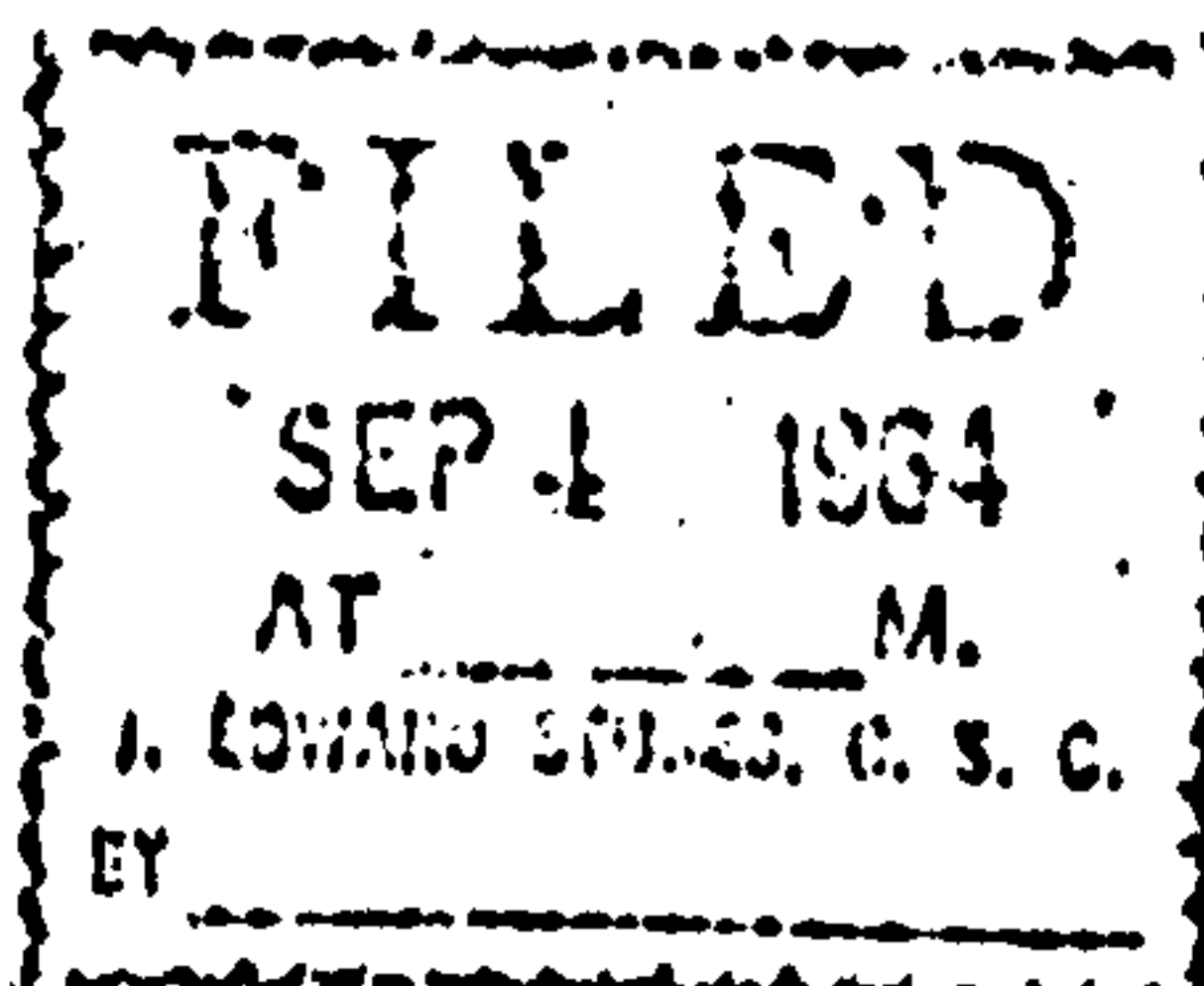

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, W. Phillip Deakin, of Birmingham, Alabama, being this day of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, hereby revoking any and all other Wills and Codicils thereto I may ever heretofore have made.

ONE

I desire and direct that all my just debts, including the expenses of any possible last illness and of a fitting funeral, shall be paid first by my hereinafter named Executrix, as soon as possible after my decease.

TWO

All of my estate, real, personal or mixed, of whatsoever nature and wheresoever situated, after payment of those items mentioned in the next preceding paragraph and the cost of administration of my estate, I hereby will, devise and bequeath unto my wife, Marguerite Isabelle Deakin, to be hers absolutely, to use and enjoy, encumber or dispose of, in part or in whole, whenever and howsoever she may see fit.

THREE

I hereby nominate and appoint my said wife, Marguerite Isabelle Deakin, Executrix of this my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, and I direct that she shall not be required to give bond or to file any inventory or appraisement of my estate in any court. During the administration of my estate, I hereby vest in my said Executrix full power to sell, convey, exchange, lease for a period beyond termination of the administration of my estate, or for a less period, improve, borrow on the security of, encumber, or otherwise dispose of, all or any part of my estate, in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as she as such Executrix may approve, to make such investments as she may consider suitable or desirable, free of the control and supervision of any court in the exercise of such power and discretion.

FOUR

In the event my said wife predeceases me, or that she and I shall die in a common accident or disaster, or under any circumstances creating any doubt as to which of us may have shortly survived the other, then and in either of those events, I hereby will, devise and bequeath all that remains of my estate after payment of those items mentioned in paragraph "ONE" hereof and the expenses of administration of my estate equally to my two daughters, Marjorie N. Atkins, of Fairfax, Virginia, and Dorothy Morgan, of Gibbstown, New Jersey, absolutely, share and share alike; and in the event either of my said daughters should predecease me, or die before she has received her share of my estate, then I direct that such share as she would have received shall descend and be divided equally among such of her children as survive her.

FIVE

In the event my aforesaid wife does not survive me, or that she and I shall die in a common accident or disaster, or under any circumstances creating any doubt as to which of us shortly survived the other, then I hereby nominate and appoint my older daughter, Marjorie N. Atkins, of Fairfax, Virginia, Executrix of this my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, and I hereby expressly exempt her from the posting of bond for the faithful performance of her duties as such and from the necessity of the filing of any inventory, appraisement, or accounting of my estate in any court, and during the administration of my estate, I hereby vest in her as such Executrix all the powers, privileges and discretions vested in my wife as such Executrix as outlined in that foregoing paragraph by which she is appointed Executrix if she survives me; and in the event my daughter, the said Marjorie N. Atkins, does not survive me or declines or for any reason omits within a reasonable time to qualify as Executrix, then I hereby nominate and appoint my other daughter, Dorothy Morgan, Executrix of this my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, and do hereby expressly exempt her from the necessity of posting of bond for

the faithful performance of her duties as such and of the filing of any inventories, appraisements or accounting of my estate in any court, and do hereby, during the administration of my estate, vest in her as such Executrix the same powers, privileges and discretions as are hereinabove vested and outlined for my aforesaid wife as such Executrix; and to whichever of my said daughters shall serve as Executrix, I hereby grant full power and authority to sell and convey, and make and deliver all such instruments, Bills of Sale, Deeds of conveyance, etc., as are necessary for the distribution of my estate to those entitled thereto upon completion of the administration.

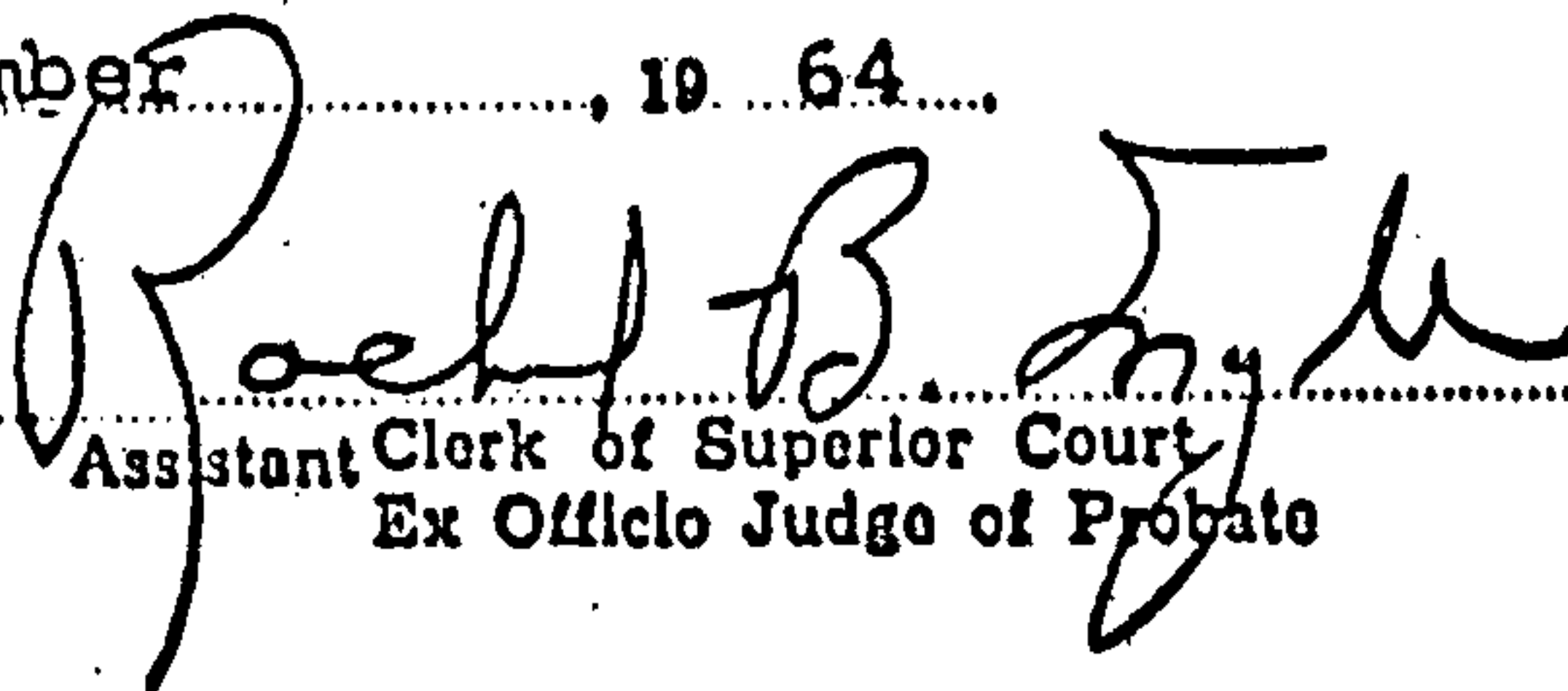

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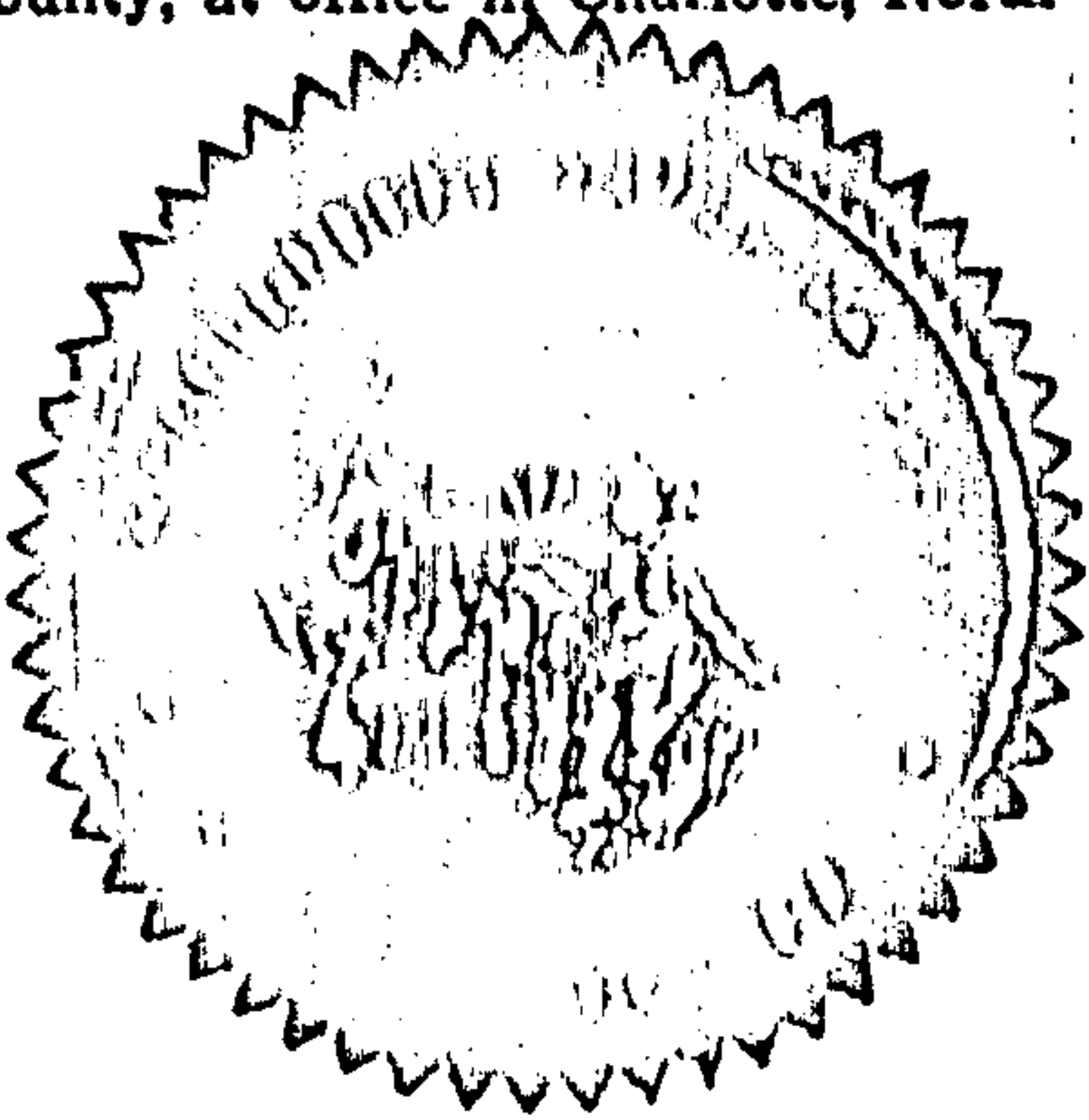
