SILLER, a resident citizen of said County and State, being now of sound mind and disposing memory and above the age of twenty one years, and desiring to make my last will and testament, do hereby, make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all wills heretofore made by me.

ITEM ONE: It is my desire, and I hereby will and direct that all of my just debts be paid by my Executors as soon after my death as possible.

ITEM TWO: I hereby will and devise to my beloved wife, Verta Eiler Siller, the dwelling house located on East Street in the City of Talladega, Alabama, together with all the furniture and household goods therein, to remain to her and her heirs forever, and should she die before me, then I hereby will and direct that the same be divided equally among my children, to wit: Gordon E. Siller, later known as Byron, Floyd E. Siller, James E. Siller, Robert A. Siller and Frank Ross Siller, or their heirs, and if any of them be dead at the time of my death or future marriage of my said wife, leaving no issue living, then I hereby will and direct that the same be divided equally among the surviving children, and should any of my said children be dead at the time of my death or future marriage of my said wife, leaving descendants, then in that event, it is my desire, and I hereby will and direct that said descendants of said deceased child or children shall receive the interest in said property that their parent would have received if living.

It is my desire, and I hereby request my wife, that should any of my children at any time in the future be in need of a home and express the desire to occupy the above referred

home with my wife, that the grant said child or children this privilege.

I hereby All the balance of my property, real, personal and mixed, of whatever kind, of what or description, which I now own or may own at the time of my death, I hereby will, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary Ellen Wilder, and to my children, to wit: George W. Wilder, John L. Wilder, Mary Ellen Wilder, M. Wilder, and L. Wilder, and to their descendants, should any of my said children be dead at the time of my death leaving no descendants, then in that event, it is my intention, and I hereby will and direct that my property be divided among the surviving children or their descendants, and my wife, should she survive alike; and should any of my said children be dead at the time of my death, leaving no descendants, then in that event, it is my intention, and I hereby will and direct that the said property be divided among the child or child or children who survive, and the share of each of their parent could be divided among the children desired to be expressed in this deed as I desire that the child's portion of my estate.

I hereby I desire that my wife, Mary Ellen Wilder, and my children, George W. Wilder, John L. Wilder, Mary Ellen Wilder, M. Wilder, and L. Wilder, and to their descendants, should any of my said children be dead at the time of my death leaving no descendants, then in that event, it is my intention, and I hereby will and direct that the said property be divided among the child or child or children who survive, and the share of each of their parent could be divided among the children desired to be expressed in this deed as I desire that the child's portion of my estate.
