My name is Forrest Lovett. I have been familiar with the hereinafter described land for 60 years or more and have known the parties in possession of it. Said land being described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, Township 22 South, Range 1 East, Shelby County, Alabama, and run north 325 feet to an iron pin on Section line; thence west a distance of 921 feet to a point in center of paved Shelby County Road No. 23, this being the point of beginning of land conveyed; thence continue west a distance of 324 feet to a point; thence south 273 feet to a point in center of said County Road; thence northeasterly along center of said County Road a distance of 503 feet to the point of beginning. LESS AND EXCEPT that part of said property included within the right-of-way of said road; situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

I know M. T. Horton during his life time and I know of my own knowledge he has been dead for some 35 years or more.

I am married to one of Earl Horton's daughter's, namely Marie Horton Lovett.
