SECOND: All the rest, residue and remainder of my property, real, personal and mixed, of which I may die, seized and possessed, or to which I may be entitled at the time of my death, I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Versie J. Mooney, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD ABSOLUTELY AND IN FEE SIMPLE.

THIRD: Should my wife, Versie J. Mooney, and I die at the same time or under such circumstances as to make it impossible to determine which of us died first, or should she predecease me, I give, devise and bequeath all of my property to my step-daughter, Dawn Turner McGowin, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD ABSOLUTELY AND IN FEE SIMPLE.

FOURTH: I nominate and appoint my wife, Versie J. Mooney, Executrix of this my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT AND EXEMPT her from making any bond as such Executrix and declare that she shall not be required to make any report to any Court of her actions as such Executrix. Should my wife, Versie J. Mooney, be unable or unwilling to act as such Executrix, I nominate and appoint my step-daughter, Dawn Turner McGowin, as Executrix of this my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT AND EXEMPT her from making any bond as such Executrix and declare that she shall not be required to make any report to any Court of her actions as such Executrix.
