

Personally appeared before me, the undersigned authority in and for said County, in said State, CORA REESE, who after first being duly sworn, deposes and says:

My name is CORA REESE. JOE REESE was my husband. The said JOE REESE was the grantee in that deed recorded in Volume 73, at page 418 in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama.

JOE REESE and I were married to one another in Montgomery County, Alabama on December 20, 1906. As children we were reared in the same County and I knew JOE REESE from the time he was a small boy.

JOE REESE departed this life intestate in Jefferson County, Alabama, but while a resident of Shelby County, Alabama, on the 22nd day of March, 1954. Prior to the death of JOE REESE he sold about one acre of the property described in the above mentioned deed. At the time of the death of the said JOE REESE he and I were occupying the balance of the property described in the above mentioned deed as our home.

JOE REESE never had a child born to him and consequently left no child and left no descendants of a deceased child surviving him. The mother and father of JOE REESE died before he did.

JOE REESE was an only child. He never had a brother and he never had a sister. JOE REESE left surviving him no brother, no sister, and no descendants of a deceased brother or sister.

There has been no administration proceeding upon the estate of JOE REESE, as none was necessary, as all of his debts, funeral expenses and expenses of his last illness have been so paid in full.

JOE REESE owned no property at the time of his death death other than part of the property described in the above mentioned deed.
