My name is W. L. Harris. I am more than 65 years of age. I reside in Alabaster, Alabama. I have lived in this community for the past 45 years and am familiar with the ownership and possession of lands in the area. I am familiar with the lands owned by Alabaster Lime Company and described as follows:
